

Social Security is here for you, not just when you need us financially, but when you need accurate information about our programs, retirement, and more. There are many online sources for Social Security information, but you need to make sure you're getting the right information.

By using <u>www.socialsecurity.gov</u>, you know that what you're reading and watching is approved by our experts and specifically created for you. Here are five of our resources that can offer you invaluable information.

Want access to our latest news, retirement planning tips, and helpful information? Social Security Matters is our blog at <u>blog.socialsecurity.gov</u>. From there, you can also connect with us on Facebook, Twitter, LinkedIn, and YouTube, where you can watch our popular videos.

Our online calculators, such as the Retirement Estimator, the Life Expectancy Calculator, and the Early or Late Retirement Calculator, can be found at <u>www.socialsecurity.gov/planners/calculators</u>.

Have you lost or misplaced your Social Security card? Find out how to get a new, replacement, or corrected card at <u>www.socialsecurity.gov/ssnumber</u>. In fact, you may be able to quickly request a replacement card online with a *my Social Security* account, if you meet certain qualifications, at <u>www.socialsecurity.gov/myaccount</u>.

Verify your annual earnings and review estimates of your future Social Security benefits when you access your *Social Security Statement*, one of the many services available with a *my Social Security* account at <u>www.socialsecurity.gov/myaccount</u>.

<u>SB 52-known as Adi's act</u>

The passing of this bill ensures that all school districts throughout the State of Oregon will be required to have a comprehensive district wide plan to address student suicide prevention

Signed by Governor Kate Brown on 5/24/19

SB 698- Prescription Drug Labeling

The Passing of this bill ensures that all labels or inserts be available in English and another language as requested by "practitioner, patient or patient representative"

Signed by Governor Kate Brown on 6/20/19

HIV Continuum of Care Conference Sept. 24 – 25, 2019 Sheraton Portland Airport Hotel

The **Oregon AIDS Education and Training Center**, in collaboration with the **Oregon Health Authority**, is hosting the 2019 HIV Continuum of Care conference - a two-day training event for individuals in a professional role to support those at risk of or living with HIV/AIDS in their community. This includes clinicians, nurses, pharmacists, case managers, care coordinators and community health workers.

Presentation topics include:

Ending the HIV Epidemic • HIV Prevention & Treatment in Rural Oregon Pre-Exposure Prophylaxis (PrEP) Addressing Disparities in Care • HIV/ STI Update • Trauma Informed Care • Women and HIV

This inter-professional training opportunity will balance clinical and social service supports to improve patient engagement in care. Content will address disparities facing clients living in more rural communities.
