



Cascade AIDS Project Announces:

Preston Gardner (he/him/him), is a new Housing Navigator, and Claude Ceniceros Jacinto (he/him/his), is a new Bilingual Housing Navigator at the CAP- Davis Street Office.

Preston is originally from Colorado and moved to Portland 4 years ago. He currently works as the lead Peer Support Specialist over at QUEST and is embedded at the Multnomah County Health Clinic 2 days a week. In his work as a peer, Preston helps participants get connected to a multitude of services and started a weekly recovery group at MCHC.

Claude is a Portland native and currently works as a Mobile Navigation & Assessment worker with El Programa Hispano. His position is split between two sites, Catholic Charities & TPI and involves completing VI-SPDAT assessments, getting individuals pulled for coordinated access document ready & providing navigation services for additional resources.

The Bilingual Prevention Navigator provides community-based HIV/STI prevention and linkage to care services, primarily targeting MSM (men who have sex with men) and other populations disproportionately impacted by HIV: primarily in Washington County.
