#### **Condom Distribution Update**

OREGON PREVENTION PROGRAM At the beginning of 2021, Oregon Health Authority began a new partnership for free condom distribution. Oregon residents can now order a free envelope of condoms and lubricant delivered discreetly to their door, up to twice per 30 days. As of April 11th, 1,315 condom orders have been filled. That is a total of 26,300 condoms! Condom orders have gone to 31 of the 36 Oregon counties, and the top five counties for orders are Multnomah, Lane, Washington, Linn, and Clackamas (in that order). #### **Website Updates**

The OHA STD Prevention <u>site</u> (healthoregon.org/std) is regularly updated with resources for the public, providers, and public health professionals. Recent additions include:

- A centralized location where Oregonians can order free condoms and find STD testing and treatment sites
- Client education about three-site chlamydia and gonorrhea testing
- Sexual health questions for providers to ask all patients.

OHA also has a new page full of information about <u>COVID-19 and HIV</u>, and a <u>page with tips</u> to help clients set testing or medication reminders on their phones.
