Legal notice of public review and comment period concerning proposed changes to the combined Project Priority List (PPL) attached below for Oregon's Drinking Water State Revolving Fund (DWSRF) for State fiscal year 2017. This portion of the combined PPL is specific to our Drinking Water Source Protection (DWSP) Program.

One of Oregon Health Authority (OHA) Drinking Water Services (DWS) responsibilities as a state agency managing the DWSRF program as set forth under Section 1452 (40 CFR 35.555 (b)) of the amended 1996 Safe Drinking Water Act (SDWA) is to provide the public the opportunity to comment on changes to the Intended Use Plan (IUP) as a part of the grant application process to the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA). The PPL is important to how the DWSRF program implements the IUP. DWSP projects are related to the protection of drinking water sources. They will be rated (i.e., scored) to determine ranking and placement on the PPL. Funding for ready-to-proceed projects will be in the form of a grant up to \$30,000 per Applicant and/or a loan up to \$100,000 per project.
