RAC Briefing on RPS Budget Projections for 2009-2011 and 2011-2013

RML program ending balance for 2011 currently projected to be ~\$175K negative with current staffing due to increased program costs; DHS cost allocation formula; and Information Technology support charges

Request approval of 20% increase in licensing fees starting July 1, 2010 to balance revenue and maintain Agreement State program status with U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission

Oregon fees are regionally lower that State of Washington and much lower than U.S. NRC (e.g. Industrial Radiography \$3K vs \$9-12K (WA) and \$22-28K (NRC)

Fee schedule will be limited to current statutory cap of \$3K per license authorization issued. This will impact ~10 license authorizations of ~455 current licensees in Oregon Health Division

20% fee increase will generate ~\$140K per year and will allow program cost recovery within 3 years to stabilize funding for licensing and inspections

In 2013-2015 Legislative session, RPS may also propose a funding package for adding cost recovery to the current fee structure to set a professional hourly rate for unusual licenses, re-inspection of noncompliant facilities and cost recovery for extensive records searches with both a professional hourly rate and administrative hourly rate, depending upon staff required to handle the request. Rates would include a projected cost mix including managerial reviews and attorney reviews of complex projects.

The professional hourly rate would also be charged for response to non-licensed facilities and recovery of radioactive materials (e.g. Brooks incinerator, Landfills, scrap metal facilities, specialized environmental radiation surveys, etc.). NRC currently charges \$258 per hour and State of Washington charges \$167 per hour for hourly rates.

The cost of doing business has increased and we need to fully recover costs for program areas not currently fully funded by licensing fees (e.g. Emergency Response to ~85 incidents per year, FOIA requests, Records searches, archive costs, attorney costs, etc.)
