Meeting Summary:

Welcome Introduction of Task Force Members

Members shared:

- Name and organization;
- Organization's interest in school nursing;
- Personal interest in serving on the task force;
- o A school health experience (personal or other).

Conflict of Interest Forms were collected.

Common Language for the Task Force on School Nursing handout reviewed.

 Representative Gene Whisnant suggested adding Nurse Assistant and School Health Assistant.

Task Force establishment

 Margo Lalich nominated Nina R. Fekaris as Task Force Chair. Representative Monnes Anderson seconded. Nina Fekaris was elected as Chair of the Task Force by unanimous vote.





- Representative Whisnant nominated Margo Lalich as Task Force Co-Chair. Yousef Awwad seconded. Margo Lalich was elected as Vice-Chair of the Task Force by unanimous vote.
- Discussion on meeting times

Location

- Videoconferencing was requested by Tom Sincic so remote participants can be seen and see other members. There will always be a call in option.
- Members agreed to have alternating meetings in Portland and Salem.

o <u>Timing</u>

- Meetings will be on the first Friday of each month from 12:30-3:30pm.
- The next meeting will be April 1st in Salem.
- There will be a website where meeting minutes and other information will be shared.

Review and discussion of DRAFT Task Force Charter

• Jamie Smith described the Task Force Charter and referenced the work plan.

o <u>Charter</u>

- Mitch Kruska suggested prioritizing items in charter scope and determine if/when any future legislative bills need to be introduced.
- Jeremiah Rigsby suggest we start with establishing the need and mapping out current resources.
- Mitch Kruska proposed that not all the funding comes from the state.
 - He also suggested we look into billing Medicaid and other insurance plans.

o Workplan

- Representative Gene Whisnant briefly reviewed the legislative schedule in relation to introducing bills in the next session and mentioned there will be a very limited budget available. He suggested mapping out a plan to stagger financial asks.
- Thomas Sincic suggested starting with the HB2693 report which suggested 1 nurse per 750 students and establishing a plan to address this
- Jeremiah Rigsby would like to know the background of the suggested
 1:750 ratio.

Discussion on Task Force needs

Future agenda items

Current school nurse model/scope





- o Thomas Sincic suggested as agenda item.
- Yousef Awwad agreed brainstorming about the current school nursing setup would be helpful and looking into other successful school nursing models from around the country and world.
- Vice Chair Margo Lalich offered to speak about the MESD model as a service delivery system that services a large number of students.

Current school nurse funding sources and budget

- Maureen Hinman would like to see where current funding is coming from and what the requirements and options are around the funding.
- Chair Nina Fekaris would like to understand how school nurses are currently being funding and where private insurance company's fit in.
- Rebecca Austen added that this might be a numbers issue especially around attracting and keeping rural school nurses.
- o Vice Chair Lalich noted that there is no infrastructure to support school nurses.

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HIPPA/FERPA

Jamie Smith mentioned HIPAA/FERPA and SBHCs as future agenda items.

Data collection

- o Vice Chair Margo Lalich mentioned the need for data in order to make decisions.
- Thomas Sincic suggested data collection as a future agenda item.
- Senator Laurie Monnes Anderson agreed that we need more data. She suggested that we find out how many students are covered by CCOs.

Potential funding sources

- o Thomas Sincic suggested potential funding sources as a future agenda item.
- Representative Gene Whisnant proposes taking \$50 million out of the \$250 million going to schools (related to poverty) and using it to fund school nurses.
 - Yousef Awwad said removing \$50 million from the school fund would be a hardship for schools. He is interested in billing Medicaid if the process of billing could be simplified.
- Senator Laurie Monnes Anderson mentioned that we want to get away from feefor-service.
- o Mitch Kruska mentioned Medicaid dollars directed to school health services.
- Maureen Hinman suggested community benefits from hospital systems as a potential funding source.
- Chair Fekaris suggested private insurers paying for school nursing services.

CCOs

 Jeremiah Rigsby noted that CCO models are different throughout the state and how they support school nursing will be different.





Suggested topics

Workforce

- Senator Laurie Monnes Anderson mentioned needing to understand more about the current school health workforce and how one becomes a school nurse
- o Rebecca Austen mentioned that the role of a school nurse is so independent that it is difficult for a new nurse to take on a school nurse role.

• Key informants

o Thomas Sincic asked the Task Force to establish other key informants.

Telehealth

 Thomas Sincic mentioned the need to explore technological options including telehealth.

• School-Based Health Centers

- Rhonda Busek asked if there is an intersection between School-Based Health Centers and school nursing. Nina Fekaris answered yes, SBHCs are part of the school health system. Maureen Hinman is representing SBHCs on the Task Force.
- Thomas Sincic said a good number of SBHCs are being reimbursed for immunizations and other services that may or already are being provided by school nurses.
- Other State's School Nursing Systems
 - Yousef Awwad asked to learn from what other states are doing to support school nurses.

Next Steps

- Jamie Smith mentioned that the Task Force can bring in other necessary contacts/informants as needed. He suggested the Task Force members contact him with ideas.
- He also asked the Task Force for permission to work with the Chair, Vice Chair to develop a
 prioritization exercise for the Task Force scope before the April 1st meeting.
- Jamie will post other state school nursing information on the website.

School Nursing in Oregon 101 – Introduction

- Nicky Zimmerman RN, MSN, Oregon School Nurses' Association President: School Nursing 101, A Snapshot.
 - Rep Whisnant asked about marijuana edibles in schools
 - o Tom Sincic asked about paper shuffling and the time consuming aspect





- Ely Sanders, Oregon Department of Education, presented on Oregon laws around school nursing. His position at ODE. Half of his position covers school nursing the other covers school sexual health.
 - Yousef Awwad asked for further clarification on the ODE data and the mandated ratios
 - Maureen Hinman asked about Medicaid billing and whether it was only Medicaid Administrative Claiming (MAC)
 - Tom Sincic commented about the preventive services that school nurses provide and the system should look to avoid duplication
 - Vice Chair Margo Lalich mentioned school nurses have online forums where they
 ask other nurses for advice on medically challenging students because there is
 not a formal infrastructure setup for them to reference.
 - Ely agreed there is not a formal infrastructure for school nurse support setup.

Public Comment

- Kelly Barnett, North Bend School District 13, asked what the reality of funding and hiring school nurses in districts with inadequate or no nurses.
 - Ely Sanders responded stating retention, salary and rural areas attracting nurses are issues.
