



EOCCO Community Advisory Council Structure

- 12 counties
- Each county has a CAC
- EOCCO Regional Board, consisting of County Commissioner and Chair of each CAC
- Structure chosen by EOCCO Board
- Lake County CAC meets monthly – 90 minutes
- 25 Lake County CAC members
- Recruitment: announcements, target list, and referrals





Lake County CAC Challenges

- Longterm planning and sustainability
 - Are CAC's pursuing foundation grant funding, in addition to CCO transformation funds, to help fund the sustainability of projects and programs
 - What are potential sources of grant funding





Lake County CAC Successes

- Collaboration: Lake Health District, EOCCO, Office of Rural Health, community stakeholders, and community members/consumers
- Community involvement
 - Excited for change and desire to improve community health
 - Broad membership
 - Over 40% return rate on mail survey
 - Over 110 participated in community meetings on September 26th

STRUCTURE


- **19 member regional IHN-CCO CAC**
 - 13 OHP members,
 - 3 County staff
 - 3 Community Members
- **3 Local Advisory Committees**
 - Local committees consist of the 6 or 7 CAC representatives plus a variety of county & community partners.

PROCESS

- **Local committees advise CAC** in order to gain a broader level of community involvement.
- **Local committees** meet bi-weekly (2 hours)
- **CAC** meets bi-monthly (2-3 hours)
- **Recruited** via CCO & County websites, mailing lists, local committee announcements & Fliers, newspaper ads, word of mouth, etc.
