Remember To Log In Regularly!

The Service Desk is tightening security

Your user name will automatically become disabled if you do not log into the MOTS web portal within 90 consecutive days. If you have a P number for use with MOTS, and especially if your agency/facility submits data to MOTS via Client Entry, it is very important that you log into MOTS regularly! The Service Desk has tightened their security, so they are now requiring a "786 Form" to be completed if a user name becomes disabled.

- To get the 786 Form, email MOTS.support@state.or.us
- Follow the form instructions and return it to MOTS support
- Once MOTS support receives the form, we will ask a Health Systems Division manager to approve the form and send it to the Service Desk for processing
- It may take several days to reactivate your account

The best thing to do is to make sure you and the other MOTS users within your facility log into MOTS a minimum of once per month. Your password will still expire after 90 days, but you can change that yourself at <https://dhs.oregon.gov>

Non-Medicaid Services

The MOTS team is developing a new report to send to agencies regarding non-Medicaid Services. Non-Medicaid services include any type of service paid for with public funds that are not Medicaid. This would include money your agency receives from the County, grant funds, etc. Also, DUII and Methadone services must be reported in the non-Medicaid Services section of MOTS. If you don't believe your agency provides any non-Medicaid services, please e-mail MOTS.Support@state.or.us to let us know, so we can remove you from the list of agencies providing these services.

Billy Has Completed Treatment...And Is Still Testing Positive For Drugs

Take a look at "Positive Alcohol/Drug Tests Past Reporting Period" before submitting a Treatment Completed record

You see, when Billy was admitted he had 2 positive tests recorded in that field; when the record was updated it was 2, when he completed treatment it was still 2. Was he tested 6 times or just twice and the field was never updated?

The Positive Alcohol/Drug Tests Past Reporting Period field should capture the number of times that the client's urinalysis samples tested positive for alcohol or drugs during the reporting period. The "reporting period" could be the last 30 days before treatment or 90 days since the last update.

This data is required for SAMHSA reporting and it also tracks what contributes to successful outcomes. When clients complete treatment it is good practice to look closely at this field along with "Frequency of Use" before submitting and update all fields necessary.
