UPDATES

Staff provided the following updates:

DASHBOARDS

- The July dashboard for April 1, 2015 – March 31, 2016 measurement was released July 27th. Improvement targets for the EHR based measures, DHS custody 2015 results by assessment type, and updated opioid PIP files were also posted.
- Staff noted changes to the Business Objects account set up and access request process are resulting in delays. Account holders are reminded to login every 60 days to avoid reset.
- Staff are also considering implementing additional mental health conditions as slicers in the dashboard and requested TAG feedback on which conditions would be of greatest interest. These slicers would be in addition to the current SPMI slicers. Staff will send out a brief online survey to collect TAG feedback on potential mental health slicers.

IMMUNIZATION CALL

As requested at the last TAG meeting, a dedicated call to talk about the ALERT immunization data has been scheduled for Monday, August 1st at 10 AM.

METRICS & SCORING COMMITTEE

The Committee met in June and agreed to keep the measure set the same for 2017 – will not add or drop any measures. At their July meeting, the Committee selected most of the 2017 benchmarks, but will finalize selection in August.

The Committee will consider changes to the Patient-Centered Primary Care Home enrollment measure to accommodate the new tier structure that will begin January 2017. Staff will provide additional information about the new PCPCH tiers, and a webinar for CCOs is being planned for October that will cover the new structure / standards.

HOSPITAL METRICS

- Year 3 specifications and improvement targets are being released to hospitals, and the Hospital TAG continues to develop an emergency department-based opioid prescribing measure.
- Four new Hospital Committee members have been appointed.

TRANSFORMATION CENTER TECHNICAL ASSISTANCE

Immunizations: Anna Warner from WOAHA shared her experience with the root cause analysis technical assistance with two clinics. Root cause analysis consultation and regional community convening support are still available from the Transformation Center. Email Metrics.Questions@state.or.us to initiate a request for technical assistance.

Smoking Cessation:

- EHR support available through the Office of Health Information Technology TA resources. Staff summarized available TA and asked for feedback on whether additional guidance on how to extract the new smoking prevalence measure from EHRs would be helpful.
- The Transformation Center has contracted with Carol Gelfer to identify available training resources for CCOs and providers. Carol shared her activities for 2016 and 2017 and asked any CCOs willing to connect and talk about their TA needs / experiences in this area to contact her (via metrics.questions@state.or.us).

FOOD INSECURITY SCREENING SPECIFICATIONS

After several months of reviewing draft specifications and discussing intent for the proposed PIP measure, a bifurcated approach was suggested in April, with specifications detailed for both population and provider/clinic level reporting. In June, TAG reviewed this approach and ultimately agreed to focus the measure on just provider/clinic level. Updated specifications were provided for final review. TAG discussion included:

- A decision to add numerators and denominators across all clinics to calculate the CCO-wide rate, with a note that clinics should be aggregated by provider type (e.g., food insecurity screening rate for all primary care providers, all mental health providers, all public health providers, etc...).
- The value of geolocation for patients included in the measure, and whether race/ethnicity, zip code, and other potential demographic indicators could be included in the reporting. A new section regarding patient-level data will be added to the specification sheet.
- Whether the various standardized screening tools were available in other languages, and if not, should they be translated more broadly before being recommended for use? A decision was made to recommend the USDA two question screener as the primary food insecurity screening tool, as it is available in multiple languages, with the other tools being listed as secondary options (similar to how the ASQ is the recommended screening tool for developmental screening, but not the only tool).
- Whether data from the Oregon Trail Card program can be used in aggregate to help with tailoring interventions or for comparison. Staff will explore options for inclusion in the to-be-developed guidance document.

YEAR 4 GUIDANCE FOR EHR-BASED MEASURES / MACRA

Kate Lonborg provided an overview of the Year 4 guidance, including the patient-level test data, and the reporting parameters by program year (looking beyond Year 4). She also provided a status update on the Clinical Quality Metrics Registry RFP and invited CCOs who are interested in participating in vendor evaluation demos to contact her at: Katrina.M.Lonborg@state.or.us.

Note the CQMR will not be operational for the Year 4 (2016) measure submission, which will continue using the template-based submission from Year 3.

Kate also provided an overview of aspects of the 2015 Medicare Access and CHIP Reauthorization Act (MACRA) and the new Merit-based Incentive Payment System (MIPS) and how they related to Meaningful Use, future eCQM measure development, and potentially CQMR reporting. Discussion included:

- Whether MIPS was on CCO / provider radar screens? Generally on CCO radar, but still in planning stages. CCOs indicated it would be helpful to have ongoing conversations about MIPS / MACRA moving forward.
- How CQMR and qualified registries or Qualified Clinical Data Registries (QCDRs) for MIPS reporting might fit together, and the value of a 'report once' functionality.
- How MIPS / MACRA metrics seem to anchor exclusively in primary care, and how this might relate to future measure development in Oregon (e.g., Kindergarten Readiness).
- How MIPS / MACRA reporting might interface with Comprehensive Primary Care Plus (CPC+), now that Oregon has been selected as a region and many CCOs will be participating.
