

Summary of Metrics & Scoring Committee August 16th Decisions

Challenge Pool Measures

The Committee approved leaving the depression screening and diabetes control measures in the challenge pool for the first measurement year (CY 2013). CCOs will receive challenge pool funds tied to these two measures if they meet the criteria for the technology plan and providing proof of concept data for the clinical measures. *Pending CMS approval.*

Measurement Year #1 (CY 2013)

- *SBIRT* - The Committee agreed to not add HCPCS codes H0049 and H0050 to the SBIRT measure specifications; OHA will publish a finding indicating that CPT code 99408 can be billed for services 8-15 minutes.
- *Electronic Health Record Adoption* – The Committee agreed to adopt the zip-code based denominator. OHA will provide final specifications and baseline data shortly.
- *Elective Delivery* – The Committee agreed to adopt the proposed approach of applying Joint Commission hospital EED rates to each delivery to create weighted averages for each CCO. OHA will provide final specifications and baseline data shortly.

Revised Improvement Targets

The Committee accepted the TAG recommendations for the following improvement targets.

- *Prenatal Care* – TAG recommended dropping the 3 percentage point floor for CY 2013 and reinstating it for CY 2014.
- *Developmental Screening, Follow Up Care for Children Prescribed ADHD Medications, and Follow Up after Hospitalization for Mental Illness* – TAG did not recommend any changes to the improvement targets.
- *Mental Health and Physical Health Assessments for Children in DHS Custody* – TAG recommended keeping the 3 percentage point floor for CY 2013, and revisiting the floor for CY 2014 after OHA/DHS establish a notification process for when children enter custody. TAG also recommended revisiting the benchmark of 90% for CY 2014.

The Committee also agreed to modify the measure to within days of notification, rather than within days of custody. OHA will revise the specifications after the new DHS/OHA notification feed launches.
