Overview of the CCBHC Planning Grant	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Overview of grant provided by Mike Morris <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ In 2014, Congress passed the Excellence in Mental Health Act. ○ Twenty-eight states awarded planning grant funds in October 2015. Demonstration grant application is due October 2016 and will be awarded to eight states. ○ Oregon will certify up to 30 CCBHCs ○ Governance of CCBHCs will need to be 50% consumer ○ During the planning grant phase there is no PPS and no data collection ○ During the demonstration grant phase there is PPS and data collection ○ Five positions at OHA funded by the grant. A project director is hired.

	<ul style="list-style-type: none">○ State does have some funding for technical assistance● Overview of Prospective Payment System (PPS) provide by Jamal Furqan<ul style="list-style-type: none">○ CMS and SAMHSA are also working on PPS○ Payment methodology is based on Medicaid eligible, but must treat anyone who comes through the door (Medicaid and non-Medicaid alike)○ There is an opportunity for some quality payments based on metrics in the grant
Overview of Behavioral Health Home Work	<ul style="list-style-type: none">● CCBHC must meet BHH requirements; BHH does not need to meet CCBHC requirements● State will provide a CCBHC/BHH crosswalk
Purpose of the Group & Subcommittees	<ul style="list-style-type: none">● Use workgroup as a way to bring/resolve issues forward, not just provide updates● Need to identify a process to identify interested clinics that want to pursue becoming a CCBHC; advisory committee can assist with this● Need to identify and recruit membership● Much of the CCBHC planning grant work will be done via email, webinars, and Advisory Group subcommittees (to be announced)● Need to fill gaps in Advisory Group membership
Technical Assistance	<ul style="list-style-type: none">● A link to the readiness tool will be provided● The state is actively working on technical assistance and is working with OPERA, AOCMHPs, and Lane county to pool resources● SAMHSA is conducting regular TA calls with the state● An event with Dale Jarvis (consultant) and Rebecca Farley (National Council) is scheduled for January 22, 2016 in Eugene
