Message:

As of October 1, 2013, approximately 80,000 households will have one or more of their members disenrolled from their dental care organization (DCO) and enrolled in the coordinated care organization (CCO) that now provides dental care.

- These members were previously enrolled in a CCOB for medical and mental health care and a DCO for dental care.
- Starting October 1, these members will be enrolled in a CCOA that provides medical, dental and mental health care (see table below).

The DCO to CCO transition does not change member choice. New OHP members will still have a choice of plans.

- If a member chooses a CCO and a DCO that will be working together as a CCOA, enroll in the CCOA.
- If a member chooses a CCO and DCO that are not working together as shown above, enroll in CCOB and DCO.
