Data and Reports

State Health Improvement Plan: The state health improvement plan is Oregon’s plan for improving the health of all people in Oregon by 2020. It addresses the leading causes of death, disease and injury in Oregon through evidence-based and measurable strategies. The plan includes strategies specifically designed to reduce avoidable differences in health outcome experienced by many diverse communities in Oregon. Public health agencies, CCOs, hospitals, health systems, private insurers, social service organizations, and others can use the strategies outlined in this plan in their efforts to improve the health of individuals in their communities. Updated USPSTF Recommendation on Tobacco Smoking Cessation for Pregnant Women: The U.S. Preventive Services Task Force recently posted the final recommendation statement and evidence summary on behavioral and pharmacotherapy interventions for tobacco smoking cessation in adults, including pregnant women—an update to previous 2009 recommendations. The Task Force recommends that clinicians ask all adults, including pregnant women, about tobacco use, advise them to quit if they do, and provide interventions to help them quit. For adults who smoke, including pregnant women, the Task Force recommends behavioral interventions, such as counseling, to help them quit. There was not enough evidence for the Task Force to recommend in favor of or against the use of e-cigarettes for smoking cessation in adults, including pregnant women, or in favor of or against the use of medications to help pregnant women stop smoking. Updates

Oral Health Care Workforce Grant: The Oregon Health Authority, Public Health Division's Oral Health Program received a three-year oral health workforce grant from HRSA called, "Increasing Oregon's Oral Health Care Workforce through Innovative Education Models and Prevention Programs". The Oral Health Program is partnering with the OHSU School of Dentistry to increase the number of dentists and dental hygienists serving low-income and underserved populations in community-based settings (i.e. schools, FQHCs), especially in rural areas. One of the grant activities include exposing senior dental students to underserved and low-income populations in practice through four-week clinical placements throughout Oregon. The other focus of the grant is to expand the number of schools and children receiving services through school-based dental sealant programs in rural locations, as well as to increase the quality of services being provided.
