<p>CPC+ P&T Committee Membership- Jim Rickards</p>	<p>CPC+- Jim discussed the results of SB 231 and the Primary Care Spending Report. He then introduced CPC+ (Comprehensive Primary Care Plus). This is an advanced primary care model. It is a desire to see Oregon as a state participate in CPC+ with CMS. To date, we are past the first hurdle. We need to have 50% of covered lives represented and we are nearly there. CPC+ will bring enhanced and aligned services/care. For more information on CPC+, CMS has a lot of materials on their website.</p> <p>P&T Committee- There is an opening for a Physician on P&T committee. Their website will have more information.</p>

- Interim coverage guidance: Screening of women at high risk for breast cancer, and noninvasive testing for liver fibrosis in chronic hepatitis C patients;

- Cover Guidance evidence submission policy, creating a standard policy, establishing a 2 year review. Discussed a GRADE informed framework;

VbBS:

- Tension and migraine headaches;
- Severe insomnia in young children (will come back for more discussion);
