Oregon Liquor Control Commission

UPDATE: ALCOHOL PURCHASES CANADIAN DRIVER LICENSES & ID CARDS NOW ACCEPTABLE

Driver licenses and ID cards issued by a province or territory of Canada are now acceptable alone as proof of age when purchasing alcoholic beverages in Oregon. This change was contained in House Bill 2264 approved by the 2021 Oregon Legislature.

CANADIAN DRIVER LICENSES & ID CARDS ARE NOW ACCEPTABLE AS PROOF OF AGE FOR PURCHASING ALCOHOL BEVERAGES

WHAT IS ACCEPTABLE ALONE AS PROOF OF AGE WHEN PURCHASING ALCOHOL ITEMS?

- 1. An unexpired and unaltered driver license from a U.S. state, the District of Columbia, or a province or territory of Canada.
- 2. An unexpired and unaltered identification card with photo, name, date of birth, and physical description issued by a U.S. state, District of Columbia, Puerto Rico, Guam, Northern Mariana Islands, United States Virgin Islands, American Samoa, or a province or territory of Canada.
- 3. An unexpired and unaltered ID card issued by a federally recognized Indian tribe with photo, name, physical description, and date of birth.
- 4. An unexpired and unaltered passport or passport card.
- 5. An unexpired and unaltered U.S. military ID card.
- 6. An unexpired and unaltered NEXUS or SENTRI card.
- 7. Expired Oregon driver licenses and ID cards may continue to be accepted for alcohol through December 31, 2021. For more information, see the Expired ID Fact Sheet
