Oregon Liquor Control Commission
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OLCC Commissioners approve update to bottle redemption centers rule, approve restrictions for 5 businesses, and approve sanctions for liquor law violations

Portland, OR – At their monthly meeting Friday, March 21, 2014, the Commissioners of the Oregon Liquor Control Commission adopted the following administrative rule change:

OAR 845-020-0020 Redemption Centers – In an effort to streamline the application process, the changes to this rule shift the delegation authority to approve redemption center applications from the Commissioners to the Executive Director.

The Commissioners approved restrictions on the following liquor license renewals:

Café Del Toro #37, 11935 N Center Avenue, Portland; licensee is Oregon Restaurant Services, Inc.; Dan Fisher, Marwin Hofer, Michael Evans, Jim Thares, 605 Holdings, Inc., corporate principals.

Dotty's #24, 11955 N Center Avenue, Portland; licensee is Oregon Restaurant Services, Inc.; Dan Fisher, Marwin Hofer, Michael Evans, Jim Thares, 605 Holdings, Inc., corporate principals.

The Commissioners ratified the following sanctions based on stipulated settlement:

The Whiskey Bar, 31 NW 1st Avenue, Portland; will pay a fine of \$1,485 or serve a nine-day liquor license suspension for allowing an employee to provide private security services without being certified to do so. Licensee is Ink Entertainment, LLC; Kecia Nathan and I Made N Sukarna, members.

Historic Willamette General Store, 1720 Willamette Falls Drive, West Linn; will serve a 23-day liquor license suspension for one of the corporate principals being under the influence of intoxicants while on duty. Licensee is Kodiak Enterprises, Inc.; Ryan Dato, Richard Dato, Stayce Blume, Judith Dato, and Douglas Dato, corporate principals.

Optima Vina, 2803 Orchard Avenue, McMinnville; will pay a fine of \$825 or serve a five-day liquor license suspension for failing to timely submit monthly privilege tax statements. Licensee is Optima Vina, Inc.; Ryan Weeks and Kimberly Weeks, corporate principals.

Time Out Bar and Grill, 16217-16219 NE Glisan, Portland; will serve a 30-day liquor license suspension for failing to maintain liquor liability insurance or a bond with a corporate surety in the amount of not less than \$300,000. Licensee is Scott Chin.

Fandango Restaurant & Cantina, 12222 SE Stark St., Portland; will pay a fine of \$1,155 or serve a seven day liquor license suspension for permitting an employee to provide private security services without being certified to do so. Licensee is Fandango Restaurant & Cantina, LLC; Antonia Armenta, member.

Best of Szechuan, 15930 SW Regatta Ln, Beaverton; will pay a fine of \$2,640 or serve a 16-day liquor license suspension for two violations. The first violation is for failing to verify the age of a minor when she reasonably appeared to be under 26 years old. The second violation is for an employee concealing evidence and refusing to give an OLCC inspector identification when the inspector requested it as part of an investigation. Licensee is Best of Szechuan, Inc.; Wu Song Lin and Tami Yan-Ji Mei, corporate principals.

Loco Locos Burritos, 1728 SW Broadway, Portland; will serve a 30-day liquor license suspension for failing to maintain liquor liability insurance or a bond with a corporate surety in the amount of not less than \$300,000. Licensee is Loco Locos Burritos, LLC; Pablo Ornelas and Ana Maria Saucedo, members.

West Side Bakery & Café, 1005 NW Galveston #150, Bend; will serve a 30-day liquor license suspension for failing to maintain liquor liability insurance or a bond with a corporate surety in the amount of not less than \$300,000. Licensee is West Side Bakery & Café, LLC; Michael Edwards, member.

The Commissioners ratified the following stipulated settlements for failing to verify the age of a minor before allowing him or her to buy or be served an alcoholic beverage when he or she reasonably appeared to be under 26 years of age:

J's Restaurant & Lounge, 2017 Portland Road, Newberg; will pay a fine of \$1,485 or serve a nine-day liquor license suspension. Licensee is Seanco Restaurants, Ltd.; Sean Reed, corporate principal.

Argyle Winery, 691 Highway 99W, Dundee; will pay a fine of \$1,485 or serve a nine-day liquor license suspension. Licensee is Lion Nathan USA, Inc.; Stephen Myers, Thomas Snyder, Peter Kean, Gavin Hucker, and Petaluma Vineyards, Inc., corporate principals.

The Commissioners ratified the following stipulated settlements for permitting an employee(s) to mix, sell, or serve alcohol or supervise those who do without a service permit:

Wichita Pub, 11481 SE Hwy 212, Clackamas; will pay a fine of \$3,795 or serve a 23-day liquor license suspension. Licensee is Wichita Pub, LLC; Harry Donough and Allyn Donough, members.

Chapman's Three In One Station, 376 SE Main Street, Estacada; will pay a fine of \$1,485 or serve a nine-day liquor license suspension. Licensee is Chapman's Three In One Station, LLC; Roger Chapman, member.

Shimmers, 8000 SE Foster Road, Portland; will pay a fine of \$1,815 or serve an 11-day liquor license suspension. Licensee is Val's Fine Foods, Inc.; Thomas Webb and Virginia Grieve, corporate principals.

Utopia Restaurant & Lounge, 1125 NE 82nd Ave., Portland; will pay a fine of \$2,145 or serve a 13-day liquor license suspension. Licensee is Lavender, Inc.; Bichvan Le, corporate principal.

The five citizen commissioners are the policy-making body of the OLCC. They meet monthly for one or two days to make decisions on liquor licenses, rules, contested case hearings and appointments of liquor store agents. Commission meetings are held every other month at OLCC's main office, 9079 SE McLoughlin Blvd., Room 103A in Portland. Subsequent months, the meetings are held via phone.
