BOARD ACTION REPORT
May 15, 2017

The information contained in this report summarizes new, interim, and final actions taken by the Oregon Medical Board between April 16, 2017, and May 15, 2017.

Scanned copies of Interim Stipulated Orders, Orders of Emergency Suspension, Stipulated Orders, Final Orders, Termination Orders, Modification Orders and Voluntary Limitations are included at the end of this report in the order that they appear in the report. These orders are marked with an * asterisk. **Scanned copies of Consent Agreements are not posted, as they are not disciplinary action and impose no practice limitations.** Complaint and Notices of Proposed Disciplinary Action are not listed in this report, as they are not final actions by the Board. Both Orders, however, are public and are available upon request.

***Cha, Michael Jeong, MD; MD23044; Sandy, OR**

On April 18, 2017, Licensee entered into an Interim Stipulated Order to voluntarily cease initiating or maintaining psychotropic medications for patients under age 18; cease initiating or begin tapering opioids for chronic pain patients; limit prescribing for acute pain; taper concurrent benzodiazepines; and cease prescribing concurrent muscle relaxants with opioids pending the completion of the Board's investigation into his ability to safely and competently practice medicine.

***Deyo-Bundy, Brittany Janelle, MD; MD168555; Salem, OR**

On April 16, 2017, Licensee entered into an Interim Stipulated Order to voluntarily withdraw from practice and place her license in Inactive status pending the completion of the Board's investigation into her ability to safely and competently practice medicine.

***Foutz, Steven Riggs, MD; MD17523; Grants Pass, OR**

On April 20, 2017, Licensee entered into an Interim Stipulated Order to voluntarily cease prescribing controlled substances for pain and to voluntarily cease prescribing testosterone pending the completion of the Board's investigation into his ability to safely and competently practice medicine.

***Mathieson, Jessica McCurdy, DO; DO175562; Bend, OR**

On May 4, 2017, the Board issued an Order Terminating Interim Stipulated Order. This Order terminates Licensee's January 24, 2017, Interim Stipulated Order.

***Queeley, Philip William, LAc; AC00862; Portland, OR**

On May 8, 2017, the Board issued an Order of License Suspension to immediately suspend licensee's acupuncture license due to his failure to pay child support. Automatic suspension is required by ORS 25.750.

Rubin, Zarya Alexandra, MD; MD181189; Portland, OR

On May 8, 2017, Applicant entered into a Consent Agreement for Re-Entry to Practice with the Board. In this Agreement, Applicant agreed to practice for a minimum of one year under the supervision of a pre-approved mentor, who will submit quarterly reports to the Board.

***Torres, Mario, MD; MD171364; Sandy, OR**

On May 5, 2017, Licensee entered into an Interim Stipulated Order to voluntarily withdraw from practice and place his license in Inactive status pending the completion of the Board's investigation into his ability to safely and competently practice medicine.

1 3.2 Licensee must cease treating psychiatric conditions with psychotropic
2 medications for any patient under the age of 18 within 90 days. Licensee must help facilitate
3 transfer of these patients for their mental health care. Licensee may continue to provide care for
4 non-mental health diagnoses.

5 3.3 Licensee must not begin treatment for chronic pain for any new or existing
6 patient. For the purposes of this Order, chronic pain is defined as pain that persists or progresses
7 over a period of time greater than 30 days.

8 3.4 Licensee must immediately begin to taper opioid medications for any chronic pain
9 patient with an MED over 90 by at least 10% per month until patient's MED is 90 or less.
10 Alternatively, Licensee may transfer the care of any patient with an MED over 90 to another
11 physician. Licensee may continue to prescribe greater than 90 MED for chronic pain for patients
12 who are currently enrolled in hospice or who are currently receiving treatment for a diagnosis of
13 cancer. Licensee must certify on the written prescription that the patient is a hospice or cancer
14 patient.

15 3.5 Licensee must limit his prescribing for acute pain to less than 30 days, and with a
16 maximum morphine equivalent dose (MED) of 50.

17 3.6 For patients taking benzodiazepines and opioids, who have an MED of 90 or less
18 or who have been first tapered to an MED of 90 or less, Licensee must begin to taper
19 benzodiazepines. Licensee must taper by at least 10% per month until the patient is weaned off
20 benzodiazepines. Alternatively, Licensee may transfer the care of any patient for whom he is
21 prescribing benzodiazepines and opioids to another physician. Licensee may continue to
22 prescribe benzodiazepines to patients who are currently enrolled in hospice or have a life
23 expectancy of less than six months. Licensee must certify on the written prescription that the
24 patient is a hospice or cancer patient.

24 3.7 Licensee must not concomitantly prescribe opioids with muscle relaxants. For
25 current patients who are prescribed opioids with benzodiazepines, tapering will occur as outlined

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1 in terms 3.4 and 3.6, and subsequent to tapering, Licensee must not concomitantly prescribe
2 opioids with benzodiazepines.

3 3.8 Licensee understands that violating any term of this Order will be grounds for
4 disciplinary action under ORS 677.190(17).

5 3.9 Licensee understands this Order becomes effective the date he signs it.

6 4.

7 At the conclusion of the Board's investigation, the Board will decide whether to close the
8 case or to proceed to some form of disciplinary action. If the Board determines, following that
9 review, not to lift the requirements of this Order, Licensee may request a hearing to contest that
10 decision.


11 5.

12 This order is issued by the Board pursuant to ORS 677.410, which grants the Board the
13 authority to attach conditions to the license of Licensee to practice medicine. These conditions
14 will remain in effect while the Board conducts a complete investigation in order to fully inform
15 itself with respect to the conduct of Licensee. Pursuant to ORS 677.425, Board investigative
16 materials are confidential and shall not be subject to public disclosure, nor shall they be admissible
17 as evidence in any judicial proceeding. However, as a stipulation this Order is a public document
18 and is reportable to the National Databank and the Federation of State Medical Boards.

The Oregon Medical Board (Board) is the state agency responsible for licensing, regulating and disciplining certain healthcare providers, including physicians, in the State of Oregon. Brittany Janelle Deyo-Bundy, MD (Licensee) is a licensed physician in the State of Oregon.

2.

The Board received credible information regarding Licensee that resulted in the Board initiating an investigation. The results of the Board's investigation to date have raised concerns to the extent that the Board believes it necessary that Licensee agree to cease the practice of medicine until the investigation is completed.

3.

In order to address the concerns of the Board, Licensee and the Board agree to enter into this Interim Stipulated Order, which is not an admission of any wrongdoing on the part of the Licensee, and provides that Licensee shall comply with the following conditions effective the date this Order is signed by Licensee:

3.1 Licensee voluntarily withdraws from the practice of medicine and her license is placed in Inactive status pending the completion of the Board's investigation into her ability to safely and competently practice medicine.

3.2 Licensee understands that violating any term of this Order will be grounds for disciplinary action under ORS 677.190(17).

At the conclusion of the Board's investigation, Licensee's status will be reviewed in an expeditious manner. Following that review, if the Board determines that Licensee shall not be permitted to return to the practice of medicine, Licensee may request a hearing to contest that decision.

5.

This Order is issued by the Board pursuant to ORS 677.265(1) and (2) for the purpose of protecting the public, and making a complete investigation in order to fully inform itself with respect to the performance or conduct of the Licensee and Licensee's ability to safely and competently practice medicine. Pursuant to ORS 677.425, Board investigative materials are confidential and shall not be subject to public disclosure. However, as a stipulation this Order is a public document and is reportable to the national Data Bank and the Federation of State Medical Boards.

The Oregon Medical Board (Board) is the state agency responsible for licensing, regulating and disciplining certain health care providers, including physicians, in the state of Oregon. Steven Riggs Foutz, MD (Licensee) is a licensed physician in the State of Oregon and holds an active medical license.

2.

The Board received credible information regarding Licensee that resulted in the Board initiating an investigation. The results of the Board's investigation to date have raised concerns to the extent that the Board believes it necessary that Licensee agree to certain terms until the investigation is completed.

3.

In order to address the Board's concerns, Licensee and the Board agree to the entry of this Interim Stipulated Order, which is not an admission of any wrongdoing on the part of the Licensee, and will remain in effect while this matter remains under investigation, and provides that Licensee shall comply with the following conditions:

3.1 Within 60 days of the effective date of this Order, Licensee must cease the prescribing of controlled substances for pain. During this 60 day interim period, Licensee must facilitate the transfer or weaning of pain patients.

3.2 Notwithstanding Term 3.1, Licensee may prescribe no more than 15 tablets hydrocodone for patients one time immediately post-vasectomy.

The Oregon Medical Board (Board) is the state agency responsible for licensing, regulating and disciplining certain health care providers, including acupuncturists, in the State of Oregon. Philip William Queeley, LAc (Licensee) is a licensed acupuncturist in the State of Oregon.

2.

On May 8, 2017, the Board received information from The Oregon Department of Justice Child Support Program that the Licensee is not in compliance with an agreement entered into with the Child Support Program. As a result, Licensee's license to practice acupuncture is subject to suspension pursuant to ORS 25.750.

The Board therefore suspends Licensee's license to practice acupuncture without further hearing, effective immediately, pursuant to ORS 25.750.
