BOARD ACTION REPORT

July 15, 2016

On July 7, 2016, Licensee entered into an Interim Stipulated Order to voluntarily taper the prescribing of opioids or transfer care for chronic pain patients with an MED over 120, pending the completion of the Board's investigation into her ability to safely and competently practice medicine.

On July 7, 2016, the Board issued an Order Terminating Stipulated Order. This Order terminates Licensee's July 11, 2013, Stipulated Order.

On July 7, 2016, the Board issued an Order Terminating Consent Agreement. This Order terminates Licensee's June 2, 2015, Consent Agreement.

On July 6, 2016, Licensee entered into an Interim Stipulated Order to voluntarily maintain current MED levels for chronic pain patients at 120 MED or less; taper the prescribing of opioids or transfer care for chronic pain patients with an MED over 120; cease initiating chronic pain treatment for new or existing patients; eliminate carisoprodol from chronic pain treatment regimens; and cease adding or increasing benzodiazepines to patients receiving opioids, pending the completion of the Board's investigation into his ability to safely and competently practice medicine.

On July 12, 2016, Licensee entered into a Consent Agreement for Re-entry to Clinical Practice with the Board. In this Agreement, Licensee agreed to practice under the supervision of a pre-approved mentor for at least six months, to include chart review and reports to the Board by the mentor, and to continue to participate in Maintenance of Certification through her certifying board.

On July 7, 2016, the Board issued an Order Terminating Consent Agreement. This Order terminates Licensee's July 22, 2015, Consent Agreement.

This Order surrenders Licensee's medical license, and assesses a \$2,500 civil penalty.

5	3.3 Licensee understands that violating any term of this Order will be grounds for
6	disciplinary action under ORS 677.190(17).

Licensee must not perform any invasive spinal procedure without having the proctor review the case and approve the planned procedure. The proctor must submit written quarterly reports to the Board.
- 3.6 Licensee must not serve as a supervising physician for any physician assistant, nor act as a supervising physician agent for any physician assistant in the absence of the approved supervising physician
- 3.7 Licensee stipulates and agrees that this Order becomes effective the date it is signed by the Board Chair.
