BOARD ACTION REPORT
June 15, 2017

The information contained in this report summarizes new, interim, and final actions taken by the Oregon Medical Board between May 16, 2017, and June 15, 2017.

These orders are marked with an * asterisk. **Scanned copies of Consent Agreements are not posted, as they are not disciplinary action and impose no practice limitations.** Complaint and Notices of Proposed Disciplinary Action are not listed in this report, as they are not final actions by the Board. Both Orders, however, are public and are available upon request.

Copies of the Orders listed below are mailed to Oregon hospitals where the Licensee had self-reported that he/she has privileges.

***Compagno, John, MD; MD125514; Portland, OR**

On June 7, 2017, the Board issued an Order of License Suspension to immediately suspend licensee's medical license due to his incarceration in a penal institution. Automatic suspension is required by ORS 677.225.

***Heitsch, Richard Carlton, MD; MD11610; Portland, OR**

On May 31, 2017, Licensee entered into an Interim Stipulated Order to voluntarily cease treating patients with hyperbaric oxygen pending the completion of the Board's investigation into his ability to safely and competently practice medicine.

***Kimura, Hidenao, MD; MD19944; Tualatin, OR**

On May 16, 2017, Licensee entered into an Interim Stipulated Order to voluntarily cease initiating or begin tapering opioids for chronic pain patients; taper benzodiazepines for patients receiving concurrent benzodiazepines and opioids; cease prescribing carisoprodol to patients on opioid therapy; and cease initiating or begin tapering stimulants for any patients taking 60 mg or more pending the completion of the Board's investigation into his ability to safely and competently practice medicine.

***Queeley, Philip William, LAc; AC00862; Portland, OR**

On May 19, 2017, the Board issued an Order Terminating Order of License Suspension. This Order terminates Licensee's May 8, 2017, Order of License Suspension.

***Resendiz, Joseph Eleazar, DO; DO26421; Tigard, OR**

On June 14, 2017, the Board issued an Order Terminating Interim Stipulated Order. This Order terminates Licensee's December 22, 2016, Interim Stipulated Order. The termination is effective June 13, 2017.

***Ryan, William Michael, MD; MD16725; Portland, OR**

On May 16, 2017, Licensee entered into an Interim Stipulated Order to voluntarily cease initiating or begin tapering opioids for chronic pain patients; limit prescribing for acute pain; taper concurrent benzodiazepines; and cease prescribing concurrent muscle relaxants with opioids pending the completion of the Board's investigation into his ability to safely and competently practice medicine.

***Sincavage, David Louis, Jr., MD; MD156207; Gold Beach, OR**

On May 25, 2017, Licensee entered into an Interim Stipulated Order to voluntarily withdraw from practice and place his license in Inactive status pending the completion of the Board's investigation into his ability to safely and competently practice medicine.

***Watanabe, Mika Linette, LAc; AC169428; Silverton, OR**

On June 14, 2017, the Board issued an Order of License Suspension to immediately suspend licensee's acupuncture license due to her failure to pay child support. Automatic suspension is required by ORS 25.750.

8 The Oregon Medical Board (Board) is the state agency responsible for licensing,
9 regulating and disciplining certain health care providers, including physicians, in the state of
10 Oregon. John Compagno, MD (Licensee) is a licensed physician in the state of Oregon.

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12 On April 11, 2017, Licensee was convicted pursuant to his plea of guilty in United States
13 District Court, Northern District of California, of one count of Tax Evasion (26 U.S. Code §
14 7201), and was sentenced to 37 months of confinement by the United States Bureau of Prisons.
15 Licensee's sentence also includes three years of post-prison supervision, a \$75,000 fine, and a
16 \$5,426,239 restitution payment to the United States government. On June 2, 2017, Licensee
17 became an inmate of the Sheridan Federal Correctional Institution (a penal institution).

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19 ORS 677.225(1)(b) provides that a licensee's medical license is suspended automatically
20 if the licensee is an inmate in a penal institution.

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22 The license of Licensee to practice medicine is suspended, pursuant to ORS
23 677.225(1)(b). This suspension will remain in effect until Licensee presents satisfactory
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
1 evidence to the Board that Licensee is no longer incarcerated and the Board is satisfied with due
2 regard to the public interest that Licensee's privilege to practice medicine may be restored.

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At the conclusion of the Board's investigation, the Board will decide whether to close the case or to proceed to some form of disciplinary action. If the Board determines, following that review, not to lift the requirements of this Order, Licensee may request a hearing to contest that decision.

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This order is issued by the Board pursuant to ORS 677.410, which grants the Board the authority to attach conditions to the license of Licensee to practice medicine. These conditions will remain in effect while the Board conducts a complete investigation in order to fully inform itself with respect to the conduct of Licensee. Pursuant to ORS 677.425, Board investigative materials are confidential and shall not be subject to public disclosure, nor shall they be admissible as evidence in any judicial proceeding. However, as a stipulation this Order is a public document and is reportable to the National Databank and the Federation of State Medical Boards.

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The Oregon Medical Board (Board) is the state agency responsible for licensing, regulating and disciplining certain health care providers, including physicians, in the State of Oregon. Hidenao Kimura, MD (Licensee) is a licensed physician in the State of Oregon and holds an active medical license.

2.

The Board received credible information regarding Licensee that resulted in the Board initiating an investigation. The results of the Board's investigation to date have raised concerns to the extent that the Board believes it necessary that Licensee agree to certain terms until the investigation is completed.

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In order to address the Board's concern, Licensee and the Board agree to the entry of this Interim Stipulated Order, which is not an admission of any wrongdoing on the part of the Licensee, and will remain in effect while this matter remains under investigation, and provides that Licensee shall comply with the following conditions:

3.1 Licensee must not begin treatment for chronic pain for any new or existing patient, and must not increase the morphine equivalent dosage (MED) for any chronic pain patient. For the purposes of this Order, chronic pain is defined as pain that persists or progresses over a period of time greater than 30 days.

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1 3.2 Licensee must not add or increase the dosage of benzodiazepines to any patient
2 receiving opioids.

3 3.3 Within 60 days of the effective date of this Order, carisoprodol (Soma) must be
4 eliminated from the treatment regimen for any patient on opioid therapy for chronic pain, and the
5 dosages must not be increased during this 60 day period.

6 3.4 Licensee must immediately begin to taper opioid medications for any chronic pain
7 patient with an MED over 90 by no less than 10% per month until patient's MED is 90 or less.
8 Alternatively, Licensee may transfer the care of any patient with an MED over 90 to another
9 provider. Licensee must not direct any other provider to prescribe for chronic pain patients on
10 his behalf.

11 3.5 For current patients receiving opioids and benzodiazepines, once opioid
12 medications are at 90 MED or less, Licensee must begin to taper the dosage of benzodiazepines
13 by 10% per month until benzodiazepines are eliminated from the treatment regimen.

14 3.6 Licensee must not begin treatment with stimulants for any new or existing patient.
15 Licensee must immediately begin to taper stimulants for any patient taking more than 60 mg of
16 Adderall or Ritalin by no less than 10% per month until patient is taking 60 mg or less.
17 Alternatively, Licensee may transfer the care of any patient taking more than 60 mg of Adderall
18 or Ritalin to another provider. Licensee must not direct any other provider to prescribe
19 stimulants on his behalf.

20 3.7 Licensee may continue to prescribe greater than 90 MED for chronic pain for his
21 patients who are currently enrolled in hospice or who are currently receiving treatment for a
22 diagnosis of cancer. Licensee must certify on the written prescription that the patient is a
23 hospice or cancer patient.

24 3.8 Licensee must not supervise any other provider's treatment of chronic pain.

25 3.9 Licensee understands that violating any term of this Order will be grounds for
disciplinary action under ORS 677.190(17).

26 3.10 Licensee understands this Order becomes effective the date he signs it.

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At the conclusion of the Board's investigation, the Board will decide whether to close the case or to proceed to some form of disciplinary action. If the Board determines, following that review, not to lift the requirements of this Order, Licensee may request a hearing to contest that decision.

This order is issued by the Board pursuant to ORS 677.410, which grants the Board the authority to attach conditions to the license of Licensee to practice medicine. These conditions will remain in effect while the Board conducts a complete investigation in order to fully inform itself with respect to the conduct of Licensee. Pursuant to ORS 677.425, Board investigative materials are confidential and shall not be subject to public disclosure, nor shall they be admissible as evidence in any judicial proceeding. However, as a stipulation this Order is a public document and is reportable to the National Databank and the Federation of State Medical Boards.

William Michael Ryan, MD (Licensee) is a licensed physician in the state of Oregon and holds an active medical license.

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The Board received credible information regarding Licensee that resulted in the Board initiating an investigation. The results of the Board's investigation to date have raised concerns to the extent that the Board believes it necessary that Licensee agree to certain terms until the investigation is completed.

3.

In order to address the Board's concerns, Licensee and the Board agree to the entry of this Interim Stipulated Order, which is not an admission of any wrongdoing on the part of the Licensee, and will remain in effect while this matter remains under investigation, and provides that Licensee shall comply with the following conditions:

3.1 Licensee must not begin treatment for chronic pain for any new or existing patient. For the purposes of this Order, chronic pain is defined as pain that persists or progresses over a period of time greater than 30 days.

3.2 Licensee must immediately begin to taper opioid medications for any chronic pain patient with an MED over 90 by at least 10% per month until patient's MED is 90 or less.



1 Alternatively, Licensee may transfer the care of any patient with an MED over 90 to another
2 physician. Licensee may continue to prescribe greater than 90 MED for chronic pain for patients
3 who are currently enrolled in hospice or who are currently receiving treatment for a diagnosis of
4 cancer. Licensee must certify on the written prescription that the patient is a hospice or cancer
5 patient.

6 3.3 Licensee must limit his prescribing for acute pain to less than 30 days, and with a
7 maximum morphine equivalent dose (MED) of 50.

8 3.4 For patients taking benzodiazepines and opioids, who have an MED of 90 or less
9 or who have been first tapered to an MED of 90 or less, Licensee must begin to taper
10 benzodiazepines. Licensee must taper by at least 10% per month until the patient is weaned off
11 benzodiazepines. Alternatively, Licensee may transfer the care of any patient for whom he is
12 prescribing benzodiazepines and opioids to another physician. Licensee may continue to
13 prescribe benzodiazepines to patients who are currently enrolled in hospice or have a life
14 expectancy of less than six months. Licensee must certify on the written prescription that the
15 patient is a hospice or cancer patient.

16 3.5 For current patients who are prescribed opioids with benzodiazepines, tapering
17 will occur as outlined in terms 3.2 and 3.4, and subsequent to tapering, Licensee must not
18 concomitantly prescribe opioids with benzodiazepines.

19 3.6 Licensee must not concomitantly prescribe opioids with muscle relaxants.

20 3.7 Licensee understands that violating any term of this Order will be grounds for
21 disciplinary action under ORS 677.190(17).

22 3.8 Licensee understands this Order becomes effective the date he signs it.

23 4.

24 At the conclusion of the Board's investigation, the Board will decide whether to close the
25 case or to proceed to some form of disciplinary action. If the Board determines, following that
26 review, not to lift the requirements of this Order, Licensee may request a hearing to contest that
 decision.

3.1 Licensee voluntarily withdraws from the practice of medicine and his license is placed in Inactive status pending the completion of the Board's investigation into his ability to safely and competently practice medicine.

3.2 Licensee understands that violating any term of this Order will be grounds for disciplinary action under ORS 677.190(17).

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At the conclusion of the Board's investigation, Licensee's status will be reviewed in an expeditious manner. Following that review, if the Board determines that Licensee shall not be permitted to return to the practice of medicine, Licensee may request a hearing to contest that decision.

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This Order is issued by the Board pursuant to ORS 677.265(1) and (2) for the purpose of protecting the public, and making a complete investigation in order to fully inform itself with respect to the performance or conduct of the Licensee and Licensee's ability to safely and competently practice medicine. Pursuant to ORS 677.425, Board investigative materials are confidential and shall not be subject to public disclosure. However, as a stipulation this Order is a public document and is reportable to the national Data Bank and the Federation of State Medical Boards.

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This Order becomes effective the date it is signed by the Licensee.

13 On June 13, 2017, the Board received information from the Lane County District
14 Attorney's Office, Family Law Division that the Licensee is not in compliance with an
15 agreement entered into with the Family Law Division. As a result, Licensee's license to practice
16 acupuncture is subject to suspension pursuant to ORS 25.750.

3.

18 The Board therefore suspends Licensee's license to practice acupuncture without further
19 hearing, effective immediately, pursuant to ORS 25.780.
