2019 Five-Year Trail Reviews:

- **Humbug Mountain Trail:** Skyler, Rod, and Jodi hiked the trail on August 9. The viewshed restoration looks fantastic. There were some recommendations for signage improvements but after the visit we learned that new signs already under design. Feedback has been provided to the Park Manager.
- **40 Mile Loop:** Robert, Jim, Del, and Jodi have reviewed portions of the trail. Information will be compiled later this year to provide to the relevant land managers.
- Willow Creek Canyon: Lauralee, Jim, Rod, and Jodi hiked the trail on September 13. Property
 ownership and public access issues were identified, along with concerns about trailheads,
 parking, signage, and more. Feedback will be provided to Jefferson County and the City of
 Madras once initial questions have been answered.

Agenda Item: Bicycle/Pedestrian Rulemaking Advisory Committee Update (Information)

The Rulemaking Advisory Committee (RAC) met on September 11 to discuss rules proposed in response to House Bill 2592, which directs OPRD to dedicate up to \$4M/biennium for bicycle/pedestrian trail projects in coordination with ODOT. The proposed rules will be released for public comment around October 1.

\$2M/biennium of the funds will be allocated by OPRD for signature, scenic, and recreation trail projects that meet transportation needs.

The public comment period ends November 4, 2019.

Signature Trails-Oregon Outdoor Recreation Initiative

OPRD Trails Project- 3 typical funding sources

- Facility Improvement Projects (FIP)
 20% new construction
 80% maintenance backlog
- Trail Services program (subset of FIP)
- Design Services-bike hubs, trail heads, hiker/biker campsites, trails

Signature Trails Policy Option Packages:

\$1.25M for the Oregon Coast Trail

\$1M for new construction for Historic Columbia River Highway State Trail support facilities.

Question/Comments:

How did you identify those Signature Trails Policy Option Packages from your last biennium?

-The Oregon Coast Trail came up as one of the projects because in 2017 we were asked to do the action plan with no funding in it. This was an effort to get some funding for the development of the action plan and an opportunity to get some funding for the maintenance of the existing of Oregon Coast Trail.

Why aren't Signature Trails under the designated trail program?

- -The designated program is a program that is in rule. If we wanted to add signature trails as a designation it would require a rule change. The commission would have to approve opening rule making.
- The intent and goals of the signature trails initiative are different than the designation program.
- We have this opportunity as ORTAC to review and provide input on those \$2M Signature Trails Projects.

The updates Planning & Design give could come with a summarizing hand that tabulates the dollars spent. An example would be a one page memo with a table that list the project and with a brief description of each project.

What counts as a trail project?

-Trails/ Amenities. Parking lots do help with the overall experience. Restrooms become a major need when you are traveling and trying to get people to treat the environment correctly.
