Need for the Rule(s):

The process for awarding heritage and museum grants has evolved over the last 15 years, and the rules have not been revised to keep up with the program changes necessary to efficiently implement current legislation and requirements. The Heritage Commission thought state-supported universities should have the same grant opportunities as private universities, which resulted in the proposed change to expand eligibility for heritage grants to include state universities. In addition, the rules lacked a definition and criteria for statewide anniversary celebrations, which creates confusion on how to designate a statewide anniversary celebration and how the department will support designated statewide celebrations.

Fiscal and Economic Impact:

We do not anticipate these rule changes to have a significant economic or fiscal impact on state agencies, units of local government, business, nonprofit organizations or the public.

Statement of Cost of Compliance:

1. Impact on state agencies, units of local government and the public (ORS 183.335(2)(b)(E)):

There is no impact on local governments, the public or most state agencies, as the grant application process remains the same for eligible organization. The revised rules expand eligibility for heritage grants to state-supported universities. For these institutions, there is a small fiscal impact associated with applying for grants. However, the process required is the same as for all other eligible organizations, and it is minimal and not unlike other requirement for grant programs offered by other cultural organizations. We anticipate the fiscal impact to come in the form of time dedicated to fill out grant applications, and if selected for a grant, reporting and reimbursement paperwork. We also anticipated the benefit of receiving a grant to far exceed the cost of applying for the grant and filling out required grant administration paperwork.

2. Cost of compliance effect on small business (ORS 183.336):

a. Estimate the number of small business and types of businesses and industries with small businesses subject to the rule:

The rules apply to non-profit organizations, state and private universities, and tribal governments. They do not apply to for-profit organizations; therefore, there is no cost of compliance for businesses, unless a business defines itself as one of the entities noted above. In such cases, the same application process and fiscal impact apply.

The rules do not apply to small for-profit businesses; therefore, they were not included in the rule development process.
