

Roster Rule

The Board finds that its “Roster” rule is obsolete and needs to be deleted. Reasons supporting this finding are as follows:

- The Board adopted this rule in 1984 to address the statutory requirement to have an annual roster of registrants available (672.635(3)). At that time, publication of an annual roster in hard-copy was best practice. With advances in technology came the ability to post roster information on a more regular schedule to the Board website. This was Board practice for many years. The Board added a license lookup feature to the website in 2013 so that current registrant data is available. These modern means of providing the roster have fully replaced the need for an annual hard-copy publication.
- The Board provides current rosters per written requests for an established fee. This is addressed in the Board’s Fee rule and does not require a separate roster rule.
- The Board also maintains an electronic copy of the roster at of the close of each fiscal year.
- This rule also refers to annual publication of the Code of Ethics, which is now called the Code of Professional Conduct and is adopted in rule at Oregon Administrative Rule (OAR) Chapter 809 Division 20. The Code is available via the Board website and the Oregon Secretary of State’s website. The Board periodically publishes reminders about the Code in its newsletters and provides a hard-copy to each new registrant. The Board finds that these means of distributing the Code of Professional Conduct are more effective than an annual hard-copy publication.
