**Anne Parrott, MS  
Coordinator,  
Public Health Emergency Preparedness

Columbia County Medical Reserve Corps**

Anne Parrott joined the Public Health Foundation of Columbia County as the Public Health Emergency Preparedness Coordinator in the fall of 2008. She holds Bachelors and Masters degrees in Speech-Language Pathology from the University of Wyoming and Idaho State University. Anne has many years of experience with diagnosis and treatment of speech-language-cognitive

communication disorders, patient and family education, and development of teaching materials, policies, procedures, and protocols.

Currently, Anne coordinates with local, regional and state public health and all hazards partners in the Portland metropolitan region. Primary responsibilities include the following: plan development and revision; staff, partner and volunteer training for a public health response; community outreach focusing on citizen and community preparedness; exercise design; and, coordination of licensed or certified healthcare professionals to strengthen a medical response in the county. She is also on the Board of Directors for the Columbia Emergency Planning Association (CEPA) and Columbia Pacific Food Bank as well as a member of the Columbia County Homeland Security Emergency Management Commission (HSEMC) and Columbia City Hazard Mitigation Team.

Outside of her work responsibilities, Anne is a volunteer with the Oregon Health Authorities' State Emergency Response Volunteer (SERV-OR) and the Oregon Radiation Response Volunteer Corps.



Adrienne Donner has been the Senior Regional Program Coordinator for the Portland Oregon Cities Readiness Initiative (CRI) since its start in 2005. She came to the program with a Masters in Business Administration from the University of Redlands and experience in community partnership building and project development.

Adrienne coordinates with Public Health and their partners in a metropolitan statistical area (MSA) that includes seven counties, two states and 2.2 million people. Her primary responsibilities include: planning with partners at state and local levels, developing plans around medical countermeasure distribution and dispensing, training volunteers, planners and responders, coordinating plans between the counties in the CRI region and coordinating with all hazard partners to strengthen the regions ability to plan and respond together. In addition to her paid duties, Adrienne is an active volunteer in the Multnomah County Neighborhood Emergency Team (NET). NET is another name for Community Emergency Response Team (CERT). In March of 2014 Adrienne earned her Certified Emergency Manager (CEM) certificate.
