

Guest Speaker for November 2012



Maj Micah Goettl has been a member of the Army National Guard for over 19 years and a veteran of two combat deployments. Originally trained as a Field Artilleryman, he currently serves on the Joint Staff for the Oregon Army National Guard as a Future Operations Officer. In his daily duties he is the Oregon State Program Manager for the CERFP.

CERFP stands for Chemical, Biological, Radiological, Nuclear, and High Yield Explosive (CBRNE) Enhanced Reaction Force Package. The unit is comprised of 197 Army and Air National Guardsman trained to provide Urban Search and Rescue, Mass Decontamination, Medical Triage and Stabilization, Command and Control, and Fatality Search and Recovery all within a contaminated environment. The Oregon CERFP is responsible for FEMA Region X as part of the National CBRNE Enterprise.
