Results

- **Conduct four (4) Phase I plan reviews.**
 - Corvallis – 2 reviews, HP being one of those.
 - Albany – 2 reviews - Oregon Freeze Dry and ATI Wah Chang.
- **Conduct two (2) Phase II plan Reviews.**
 - Corvallis – Complete their Phase II evaluation in April.
 - Albany – Conducted a Phase II evaluation, but did not have Public Works and the Hospital present. A new Phase II needs to be conducted.
- **Conduct a functional exercise at the September, 2011 meeting for a rail car chlorine leak.**
 - Conducted on September 14, 2011. 34 participants.
- **Work with emergency responders to develop a notification system to inform businesses and residents to shelter-in-place or evacuation during a release.**
 - Responders, such as Albany and Corvallis fire have or are establishing teams to provide local notification programs to provide quick alert through Linn Benton Alert.
- **Develop a resource list that can be used by facilities and emergency responders during a hazardous materials incident.**
 - Developed an initial resource list that could be used by facilities and Emergency Responders. Later discussion indicated that use by the emergency responders might not be practical and in some cases use by facilities might not be done.
- **Provide three (3) membership training sessions to take place at a regular scheduled meeting.**
 - In 2011 we had three presentations:
 - April '11 - HazMat 5 Presentation - Scott Cowan and the HazMat 5 team.
 - July '11 - The Globally Harmonized System of Classification & Labeling of Hazardous

- August '11 - Developing Emergency Response Drills for Facilities- Krista Dillon, Univ. of OR Emergency Management Department.
- Hot Topics:
 - Sheltering in Place for facilities.
 - Harrisburg School District – Evacuation vs Shelter in Place.
- **Participate in three public outreach projects to promote the Mid-Valley LEPC.**
 - We participated in one outreach project and this was at the Linn County Fair in cooperation with the Linn County Sheriff's office – made contact with up to 400 people. Held a raffle and gave away shelter in place kits.
- **Working with the State Fire Marshals' Office contact four non-participating EHS facilities and invite them to attend the Mid-Valley LEPC meetings**
 - Eight contacts of prospective members were made.
- **Follow up with four organizations who are no longer attending Mid-Valley LEPC meetings**
 - These contact were a part of the eight listed above.
- **Grants received for the 2011:**
 - \$12,000 - Training funds to support the State of Oregon Region 5 Linn/Benton Hazardous Materials Team.
 - \$7,000 – Functional Exercise for the facilities and emergency responders.
 - \$5,000 for Hazardous Materials Awareness and Operations Training for Emergency Responders through Linn Benton Training Council.
