Welcome and Review of Minutes:

The group reviewed and approved the minutes from the previous meeting.

Discussion on Typing:

The group agreed on the aerial rates as proposed during November, with the only change being a Type 3 paid at \$125.

The group agreed that the discussion about tactical vs. supply tenders be tabled until next year.

Training Plan for 2014:

Chief Carriger suggested that a two-page Quick Guide be developed. The first page would focus on typing and the second focus on the process of a conflagration request. OSFM will work on creating that document.

The timeline for the Mob Plan is as follows:

- The co-chairs will distribute a document letting the Fire Service know we are nearly ready for review.
- OSFM will complete the changes to the Mob Plan and distribute to the committee.
- Committee will approve and OSFM will distribute Mob Plan to Fire Defense Board Chiefs by January 1st, allowing them one month to weigh in via Doodle poll.
- The final document will be available for a vote during the meeting on March 19th.
- In April, OSFM will begin to deliver Task Force Leader 101, which will focus on both the TFL Guidebook and the Mob Plan.

It was agreed that the FDBC meeting will be held in Central Oregon, (Redmond or Bend), on March 19th and will have a format similar to last year. There will be a Mob Plan 101 training, an open forum lunch, and the meeting.

To Be Done:

Alan will finalize the TFL Guidebook.

Mariah will finalize the Mob Plan.

OSFM will draft a Quick Guide for typing.

The co-chairs will communicate with the FDBCs.

OSFM will work on determining a location for the March 19th training and meeting.
