Mr. Lindsay A. Ball, OWIN Director
Bio – Effective October, 2009

On November 26, 2007, Lindsay A. Ball was transferred from the Department of Administrative Services (DAS) to the Governor's Office and was assigned as the Oregon Wireless Interoperability Network (OWIN) Executive Director. Mr. Ball served as Director for DAS since January 2006. Before coming to DAS, Mr. Ball was the Director for the Oregon Department of Fish and Wildlife for five years. From 1993 to 2001, Mr. Ball served as Captain of the Fish and Wildlife Enforcement Division for Oregon State Police (OSP). In his 27-year career with OSP, Mr. Ball worked seasonal positions in Tillamook, Astoria, Newport, Gilchrist and Summer Lake; patrol officer in Portland; and field officer, sergeant and lieutenant for the Fish and Wildlife Division in John Day, St. Helens, The Dalles and Baker City. Mr. Ball, 57, holds a bachelors degree in wildlife science from Oregon State University. Mr. Ball lives in the country near the small community of Scio, Oregon.
