GUEST SPEAKER

Fire Chief Michael R. Duyck – Tualatin Valley Fire & Rescue



Mike Duyck is the Fire Chief of Tualatin Valley Fire & Rescue - a combination agency with approximately 447 career firefighters and support staff, and 100 volunteers. Tualatin Valley Fire & Rescue is Oregon's largest fire district serving a population of approximately 440,000 citizens within nine cities and portions of three counties. Tualatin Valley Fire & Rescue is accredited by the Center for Public Safety Excellence Commission on Fire Accreditation International (CPSE/CFAI).

Chief Duyck joined Tualatin Valley Fire & Rescue in 1995, after beginning a fire service career with the City of Lake Oswego (OR) in 1988. His 16 years of service with the Fire District includes all ranks within emergency services, as well as fleet services, human resources, logistics, and governmental affairs. In 2009 he became deputy chief and was responsible for the administration of Tualatin Valley Fire & Rescue while Chief Jeff Johnson served as President of the International Association of Fire Chiefs (IAFC). He became TVF&R's Fire Chief on September 1st, 2010.

Chief Duyck has a Bachelor of Sciences Degree in Fire Business Administration, and an Associate Degree in Fire Science. He also holds numerous certifications in emergency operations and is an Oregon-certified Paramedic. Chief Duyck is Chair of the IAFC

Environmental Sustainability Committee, a CFAI peer assessor, and is currently enrolled in the National Fire Academy Executive Fire Officer Program.

Chief Duyck serves as Oregon Vice-President of the Western Fire Chiefs Association (WFCA) and is the WFCA representative for the Oregon Fire Chiefs' Association. He is also involved in several local, statewide, and national fire service initiatives including emergency communications and dispatch, fire service innovation and technology, intergovernmental affairs, interoperability, and urban renewal.

Chief Duyck is a strong proponent of Community Risk Reduction initiatives. In 2011 his department kicked off a data-driven program in which all 21 fire stations now have the ability to identify risks specific to their community and create solutions to help minimize life and property loss.

In his personal time Chief Duyck enjoys coaching and watching his daughters' basketball teams, and spending time on his small family farm.
