Oregon Watershed Enhancement Board Awards \$61,322 for Land Stewardship and Sage-grouse Conservation in Malheur County

Board invests Lottery revenues in grants to assist Oregon's greater sage-grouse

The Oregon Watershed Enhancement Board (OWEB) selected the Malheur Watershed Council to receive a grant of \$61,322 at their April 25-26, 2023 board meeting in Keizer.

Malheur Watershed Council will remove juniper on privately owned property, near Brogan. The project will build on prior sage-grouse conservation, improve water quality, and enhance wet meadow function.

"Greater sage-grouse conservation is a wonderful investment of Oregon Lottery funds. It's a boost for sage-grouse, local natural resource jobs, and landowners" says Lisa Charpilloz Hanson, OWEB's Executive Director.

At its April 2015 meeting, the OWEB Board adopted a policy to make available at least \$10 million through its granting programs over the next 10 years in support of projects located in Oregon's sage steppe ecosystem directed to improve habitat. Total funding awarded to sage-grouse projects since 2015 is now \$14,033,017, including the recent grant awards made this April.

The OWEB Board awarded 72 Restoration, Technical Assistance, and Stakeholder Engagement grants totaling \$13,027,997 to local organizations statewide to support fish and wildlife habitat and water quality projects using Lottery revenue funding and federal Pacific Coastal Salmon Recovery funding provided by the National Ocean and Atmospheric Administration at their April 25-26, 2023 meeting.
