American Recovery and Reinvestment Act Delivering for Oregon

\$1.7 Billion Invested: As of the end of 2009, the state has obligated or spent approximately \$1.7 billion – or 44% – of the \$3.9 billion in total funds expected to flow through the state during the three-year program.

Special Reporting Requirements: Of the \$1.7 billion spent, the state has submitted preliminary data as required under section 1512 of the Recovery Act for a total of over \$400 million in spending for nearly 500 awards.

Thousands of Jobs Created: During the past three months, over 8,300 full-time equivalent jobs have been created or retained.

Education – K-12 and Postsecondary

\$466 million in education: A total of \$466 million in Recovery Act funding was directed to education – both K-12 and post-secondary – for the 07-09 and 09-11 budgets.

- Helped preserve the equivalent of 20 schools days for K-12 for the 08-09 and 09-10 school years.
- Retained and created more than 5,000 education jobs in K-12 and the state's seven public universities.

Direct Assistance to Oregonians

\$1.2 billion in direct assistance: Over \$1.2 billion in Recovery Act funding is in the hands of individual Oregonians to help families meet their basic needs.

- Approximately \$700 million in extended unemployment payments is helping thousands of Oregonians seeking a job.
- More than \$88 million dollars in food stamp assistance has helped the state continue to serve approximately 300,000 Oregon households each month.
- To date about \$450 million has already made it possible to provide healthcare to Oregonians through Medicaid and provide temporary cash assistance to families in need.

Public Safety

\$100 million for prisons: Approximately \$100 million invested to help keep state prisons operating.

- More than 700 full-time equivalent jobs were retained in this quarter alone.

Transportation

Hundreds of projects: Approximately \$260 million invested in 280 transportation projects statewide to repair roads and bridges.

- More than 690 full-time equivalent jobs were created or retained in transportation projects in the last three months alone.
