Claimant, *pro se*, requests review of Administrative Law Judge (ALJ) Sencer's order that: (1) upheld Liberty Northwest Insurance Corporation's (Liberty's) *de facto* denial of his new/omitted medical condition claim for lumbar disc conditions; (2) upheld the SAIF Corporation's denial of the same conditions; (3) found that Liberty properly calculated claimant's permanent partial disability benefits; and (4) declined to set aside a Claim Disposition Agreement (CDA) and Disputed Claim Settlement (DCS), approved on December 5, 2003, between claimant and Liberty.¹ On review, the issues are compensability and claim processing.

We adopt and affirm the ALJ's order with the following supplementation. After the last sentence in the last paragraph on page 7, we add the following: "ORS 656.214(6)(b) (Or Laws 2001, ch 865, § 6, *compiled as a note after* ORS 656.214 (2001)).²"

ORDER

The ALJ's order dated August 31, 2010 is affirmed.

² That statute provides for the following calculation of permanent disability benefits: "When the number of degrees stated against the disability is more than 64 but equal to or less than 160, \$153.00 times 64 plus \$267.44 times the number of degrees in excess of 64."
