On December 26, 2014, we issued an order that: (1) found no abuse of discretion in the Administrative Law Judge's (ALJ's) evidentiary rulings regarding "post-hearing" medical reports; (2) reversed those portions of the ALJ's order that upheld the insurer's denials of claimant's new/omitted medical condition claims for left pectoralis minor syndrome and left rotator cuff tendinitis/tendinosis; and (3) affirmed those portions of the ALJ's order that upheld the insurer's denials of "left shoulder strain combined with preexisting left AC joint arthritis," "left shoulder strain combined with preexisting fibromyalgia, thoracic outlet syndrome, and anxiety," and "left thoracic outlet syndrome." The insurer petitioned the court for judicial review of our order.

The parties have now submitted a proposed "Disputed Claim Settlement and Stipulation" (DCS) designed to resolve all issues raised or raisable between them, in lieu of all prior orders. Specifically, the agreement is designed to resolve the parties' dispute pending before the Court of Appeals. We are authorized to consider the parties' DCS. ORS 656.298; *Rebecca E. Seelye*, 60 Van Natta 332 (2008).

Pursuant to the settlement, claimant agrees that the insurer's "January 27, 2012 and October 15, 2012 partial denials" and "the denial contained herein," as supplemented by the agreement, are "affirmed in all respects and become final."¹

By this order, we have approved the parties' agreement, thereby fully and finally resolving this dispute, in lieu of all prior orders. Accordingly, this matter is dismissed with prejudice.
