2:00 – 2:20 Welcome Back, 2018 Work Review

- I. Review and Close-out
- II. Continuation / next steps for completed items
 - a. DAS has requested time at the next all-director's meeting to discuss EO 17-20 and provide an update, but has yet to hear back
 - b. Regarding the Plug Load Strategy, the upcoming updates to the Resource Conservation Policy will be a vehicle for this. DAS has started this process for incorporation and policy update.
 - c. BEEWG recognized an opportunity in 2019 to hold combined state agency training for Plug Load Strategy, Resource Conservation Policy, Energy Reporting, Energy Benchmarking, etc. DAS has been reinstating a regular Facility Managers meeting, so this could be a venue for training.
 - d. OHCS is looking to expand energy burden assessment, with a focus on energy use intensity
 - e. ODOE will continue to evaluate appliance standards opportunities and closely monitor the action of other states and the federal government as a follow-up to the 2018 standards report.

III. Lessons learned

- a. Meaningful stakeholder process is key. BEEWG in general felt like amount of stakeholder involvement for 2018 activity was strong.
- b. BEEWG felt in general that 2018 process went smoothly, members appreciated feedback and collaboration from the group
- c. Recognized that more time would have been better! But the group accomplished a lot in a short period of time
- d. Recognized need for expansion and continuation of 2018 work

- I. Update from BCD on Board Input

- IV. "Finished Product" Discussion
 - a. BEEWG Review of three general options
 - i. Comprehensive all-inclusive calculator/spreadsheet
 - ii. Protocol only
 - iii. Combined protocol with simplified calculator
 - General consensus was on option iii above (combined protocol and calculator) – basic calculator and protocol with adaptability depending on specific application and need
 - c. A protocol-only, without a calculator, could leave a gap
 - d. Some level of latitude and freedom is appropriate, but needs to be well-defined
 - e. Protocol should specifically address different needs for state-agency work vs. energy code work
 - f. Calculator could provide a "range" where appropriate, to demonstrate sensitivity analysis if certain input variables are unknown but have significant impact on the outcome

3:20 – 3:50 EO Item 3D Energy Efficient Equipment

- I. Review of equipment matrix
 - a. Early 2019 has focused on the "what" refinement of the equipment matrix (DEQ, ODOE, DAS), taking a tiered approach (for example, starting with Energy Star certification). Next steps, already started, are focusing on the "How" for integration with Procurement.
- II. Draft report
- III. Procurement Integration
 - a. DAS BEEWG members have met with DAS Procurement office to work on the best path forward
 - b. There is already language in ORS that supports inclusion of energy efficient procurement standards (around enhancing environmental well-being, promoting energy conservation)
 - c. There is also a statewide procurement policy in place from 2009, but this will need to be updated and modernized (or replaced with a new one)
 - d. DAS Procurement office is available to assist with policy drafting and development, and also suggested that DAS rules could also potentially be subsequently updated to better support the new policy.
- IV. Roll-out and communication

a. There are multiple potential avenues for training and communication, including integration with existing statewide procurement training program, buyer's guides, and other existing means for communicating new state policies
