Establish energy efficiency requirements for common products in order to be sold, offered for sale, or installed in Oregon


Contribute toward consumer energy efficiency, cost savings, and greenhouse gas reductions

Include a role for both State and Federal governments



- Streamlines the process for updating an existing standard to maintain alignment with other states
- Establishes consultation process with appropriate building code boards for future standards updates
