10 under ORS 469.300(11)(a)(C) and 469.320.

12 A portion of the proposed facility site boundary is located on lands or waters within the  
13 jurisdiction of City of Portland. The governing body of City of Portland is the Portland  
14 City Council.

16 Under ORS 469.480(1), the Energy Facility Siting Council must designate the governing  
17 body of any local government within whose jurisdiction a facility is proposed to be  
18 located as a Special Advisory Group.

20 THEREFORE, it is ordered that the City Council of the City of Portland is appointed as a  
21 Special Advisory Group to advise the Energy Facility Siting Council in any site certificate  
22 or site certificate amendment proceedings for the project.
