Oregon Energy Security Plan



The Oregon Department of Energy has been directed by the federal government and SB 1567 to prepare an Energy Security Plan for Oregon.

What, why, how?

The Oregon Energy Security Plan will identify, assess, and increase awareness of the threats and hazards to Oregon's energy systems and help the state plan for, respond to, and recover from events that disrupt energy supply. Quantifying and mitigating risks to Oregon's energy infrastructure will ensure a reliable and resilient supply of energy at an affordable price in the event of extreme weather events, natural disasters, man-made threats, or issues of energy affordability.

The federal government and the Oregon Legislature recognize the importance of energy security for our state, and have provided the direction, funding, and technical assistance necessary to move this plan forward. The comprehensive resource for energy security planning will be developed by the Oregon Department of Energy with funding from the Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act and in accordance with requirements set by Oregon Senate Bill 1547. To ensure the plan serves all Oregonians, ODOE will conduct outreach to gather stories and data from all regions, economic sectors, and walks of life – seeking feedback from stakeholders and Tribal Nations throughout the project.
