PROPOSED/AMENDED RULE SUMMARY: Adds language about displaying sovereign tribal government's flags in public schools.

BACKGROUND: Last school year, an Oregon Tribal Government contacted a local school district to request their Tribal flag be displayed somewhere in the building. The Tribal Government noted the district had over 30% of the student population affliated with their Tribal Government. The district contacted Oregon Department of Education for guidance and to assist in developing a policy which would allow the district to display the flag. The proposed rule offers guidance to all public schools should a sovereign tribal government wish to display it's flag in a school.

ISSUES/CONCERNS THAT SURFACED DURING RULE WORK:

After bringing initial draft rule to the October 22, 2015 State Board meeting individuals Board members recommended the following changes:

- Inclusive to Oregon tribal government flags.
 - o Rule now relfects Oregon tribal governments only.
- Requiring cultural compentency of such tribe requesting to display flag.
 - At this time, staff recommend the proposed rule to be brief and specific to appropriate guidance in displaying a tribal government flag at school. Staff anticipate brining forward separate rules requesting American Indian Alaska Native curriculum and cultural compentency in all districts.
- Require district and / or school to work in consultation with the tribe on determing location of the tribal flag.
 - Language has been added.
