PROPOSED/AMENDED RULE SUMMARY:

Amending the instructional materials adoption schedule to account for the changes in content standard adoption with implementation of Common Core. The proposed schedule will reinstate a regular timeline and allow us to plan through 2027.

BACKGROUND:

- The current instructional materials schedule ends with the science material adoption in 2016.
- The adoption schedule went off cycle in 2011 due to the adoption of Common Core standards. A bridge year adoption for ELA and Math took place that year to ensure standards aligned materials were available to districts prior to student assessment on new standards in the 2014-2015 school year.
- Science standards were adopted in 2014 by the State Board of Education and the adoption criteria were adopted in January, 2015. We plan to adhere to the currently scheduled science adoption.
- The State Board of Education has discretion on the adoption schedule. The proposed schedule gives priority to content areas in most need of updating. For example, Social Studies materials only have contracts valid until 2018. The new schedule will provide a new contract for Social Studies so that there will be no gap in contracted services.
- The contracts for Health and Art instructional materials have already expired. The Art standards were adopted by the Board this fall and we are scheduling the materials adoption during the next available opportunity.
- The proposed schedule will have World Language materials out of contract for two years, but our capacity does not allow for an earlier adoption without affecting another content area.
- We should be back on track to an adoption schedule with no gaps in contracted services by 2019.
