Evaluators were trained for the State Instructional Materials Review of World Languages in July 2020. The training materials are provided here for school districts to make use of for training their own evaluation teams. These materials may be useful in training teams for independent adoptions, or for review and selection from the state adopted list.

Instructional Materials Evaluation Tools (IMET)

The IMET (Instructional Materials Evaluation Tool) is a scoring rubric that contains the World Languages adoption criteria within it. Below you will find the IMET used during the 2020 World Languages instructional materials review for each category. Once scores have been input for each criterion, the spreadsheets with scoring automation will summarize whether a material has met the scoring threshold for adoption.
