



- Michigan Arts Education Instruction and Assessment (MAEIA) has a wealth of resources that may be helpful to start planning the school year, from example curriculum maps covering the National Core Arts Standards, to performance assessments and instructional materials.
- Tend, Gather and Grow is a curriculum dedicated to educating people about wild plants, local landscapes, and the rich cultural traditions that surround them. It is intended for K-12 teachers and community educators with a focus on serving Northwest Native and regional youth. In order to protect the plants and Native American cultural knowledge and stories featured in the curriculum, the curriculum developers ask that anyone using the materials read the Tend Teacher Guide, watch the Honoring Plants, Places and Cultural Traditions video, and take a multiple-choice quiz on the portal before accessing the free lesson materials.

Tanner Peterson, a member of the Upper Sioux Community, is the videographer and production assistant. Interviews with Gaby Strong, Pejuta Haka Red Eagle, Gabrielle Tateyuskanskan, Leah Thomas, Marcy Fiddler and Lonna Stevens discuss the materials, hand craft, adornments and cultural heritage of traditional Dakota and Lakota women's dresses.
