1. District Information & Superintendent Letter



This is a message from the district superintendent that may contain information regarding the district's performance, interventions, initiatives, expectations, or other important details.

2. District Profile

Class size is the average class size for self-contained classrooms in grades K-3 and 4-5 in 2012-2013. Note that current measures of class size will be available on the 2014-2015 report card.

This section displays information concerning student enrollment, class size, teacher proficiency, attendance, student mobility, demographics (e.g., the percentage of students who are English learners, economically disadvantaged, and students with disabilities), number of languages spoken within the district, and district policies concerning student wellness and racial equity in hiring.

The sources for this data include the 2013-2014 3rd Period Cumulative Average Daily Membership (ADM) collection and the 2012-2013 Class Size Collection.

Note that the student wellness and the racial equity in hiring policies are provided by the district. The Oregon Department of Education does not verify the accuracy of these statements.

Student mobility is the percentage of students who transferred into or out of the district and the average of each mobility rate for the previous three years.

Teacher proficiency is the percentage of courses taught by teachers within the district who were identified as highly qualified (as defined by the federal government).

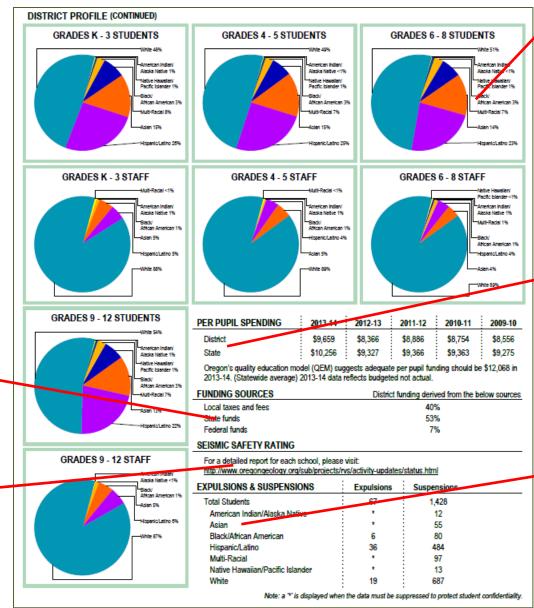
2. District Profile (Con't)

These pie charts illustrate the racial/ethnic composition of students and staff by grade band within the district.

The district profile continues on page 2 and displays information concerning student enrollment and staff by race/ethnicity for each grade band (i.e., K-3, 4-5, 6-8, and 9-12), per pupil spending and funding sources, seismic safety rating, and expulsions & suspensions by race/ethnicity.

Funding sources include the percentage of district funding from local (e.g., taxes, fees, bonds, etc.), state, and federal sources.

This link leads to a website maintained by the Department of Geology and Mineral Industries (DOGAMI) and provides a seismic safety report for most schools.



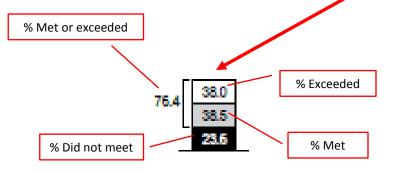
Per pupil spending consists of district and state values for the total expenditures per student from 2009-2010 to 2013-2014.

Expulsions & suspensions reflects the total number of students who were suspended or expelled by subgroup during the 2013-2014 school year.

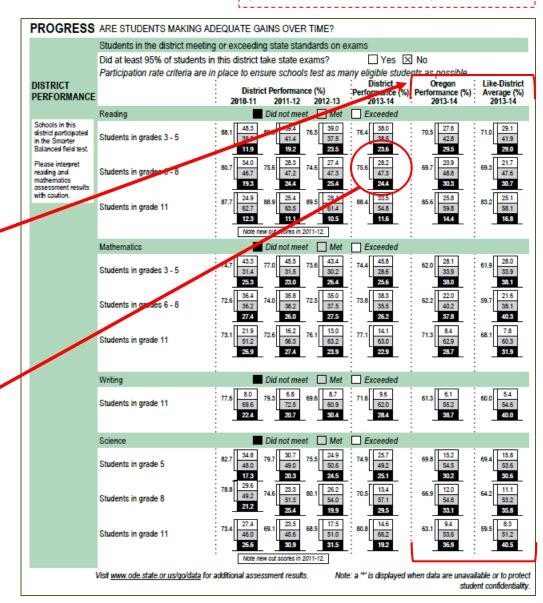
3. Progress

This section displays the district's assessment participation and performance on reading, mathematics, science, and writing statewide assessments from 2010-11 to 2013-14 by grade band. Assessment data includes students who were enrolled on May 1 in an Oregon school district, and had been enrolled in that district for a full academic year.

The <u>Oregon Performance</u> is the statewide rate and includes all students in the state who were enrolled on May 1 in an Oregon school district, and had been enrolled in that district for a full academic year. The <u>Like-District Average</u> is the performance of students in districts with similar student demographics.



Notes: Some districts had schools that participated in the Smarter Balanced field test. Please interpret the reading and mathematics assessment results with caution. An "*" either refers to unavailable data or protects student confidentiality.



4. Outcomes

This section also includes the <u>Oregon</u> <u>Performance</u> (i.e., statewide rate) as well as the Like-District Average.

College and Career Readiness contains (a) the percentage of 9th grade students who have earned enough credits by the beginning of the 10th grade year to be on track to graduate and (b) the percentage of the year's 12th grade students who took the SAT.

The <u>Graduation Rate</u> is the percentage of students that graduated with a regular high school diploma within four years of their first high school enrollment.

The <u>Completion Rate</u> is the percentage of students that earned a GED or a regular, modified, extended, or adult high school diploma within five years of their first high school enrollment.

<u>Continuing Education</u> is the percentage of students who enrolled in a community college or four-year institution within 16 months of graduating from an Oregon high school.

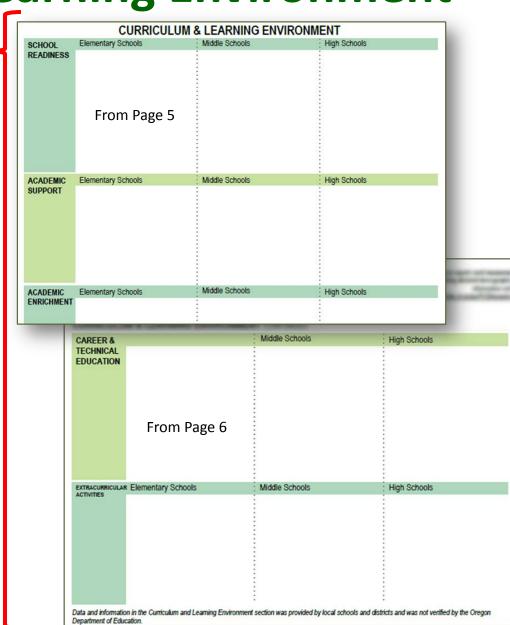

6. Curriculum & Learning Environment

Priority Schools are high poverty schools that were ranked in the bottom 5% of Title I-A schools in the state based on Oregon's rating formula. These schools generally have overall very low achievement and limited growth over time. Additional supports and interventions to make improvements are needed.

Focus Schools are high poverty schools that were ranked in the bottom 5% -15% of Title I-A schools in the state with a significant achievement gap based on Oregon's rating formula. These schools need additional support in closing the achievement gap among historically underserved student populations.

Model Schools are high poverty schools that were ranked in the top 5% of Title I-A schools in the state based on Oregon's rating formula. These schools serve as models of successful student outcomes.

This section provides the number of Title I-A school within the district that received a federal ESEA designation. Only low and high performing Title I-A schools will receive ESEA designations. These designations are Priority (bottom 5%), Focus (bottom 5% to 15%), and Model (top 5%). The 2013-2014 Priority, Focus, and Model School List provides more information concerning each ESEA designation as well as identifies the schools designated as Priority, Focus, and Model.
