

OSEP Requirements

- States must determine the percent of parents who report that the schools facilitated parent involvement as a means of improving services and results for children with disabilities. (School Age and Preschool)
- States must the percent of families who report that early intervention services have helped the family:
 - A. Know their rights;
 - B. Effectively communicate their children's needs; and
 - C. Help their children develop and learn. (Part C)
- For all three surveys: the state must measure this for parents of students/children experiencing a disability.

- For each of the three surveys: a representative sample of parents of students/children experiencing a disability are surveyed each year.
- The sampling methodology differs by survey.

School Age:

- Districts are divided into three representative groups (a 3-year survey cycle).
- For any given year:
 - Districts with **more** than 1,000 students: A **representative sample** of parents of students experiencing a disability is selected to receive the survey.
 - Districts with 1,000 or fewer students: All parents of students experiencing a disability are selected to receive the survey.
- Approximately 21,000 students experiencing a disability are surveyed each year.
- Parents of these students are mailed a survey that includes a link to an online survey.
- Parents can mail their completed survey or complete the survey online.

Preschool:

- Counties are divided into two representative groups (a 2-year survey cycle).
- For any given year:
 - Counties with **more** than 100 students: A **representative sample** of parents of students experiencing a disability is selected to receive the survey.
 - Counties with 100 or fewer students: All parents of students experiencing a disability are selected to receive the survey.
- Approximately 2,300 students experiencing a disability are surveyed each year.
- Parents of these students are mailed a survey that includes a link to an online survey.
- Parents can mail their completed survey or complete the survey online.

Part C:

- Counties are divided into two representative groups (a 2-year survey cycle).
 - The counties for the Preschool and Part C surveys are on the same cycle.
- For any given year:
 - Counties with **more** than 100 students: A **representative sample** of parents of children experiencing a disability is selected to receive the survey.
 - Counties with **100 or fewer** students: All parents of children experiencing a disability are selected to receive the survey.
- Approximately 1,300 children experiencing a disability are surveyed each year.
- Parents of these children are mailed a survey that includes a link to an online survey.
- Parents can mail their completed survey or complete the survey online.

- The School-Age Survey consists of 10 Likert items. Also included is a question about grade when first referred, programs/services the child participates in, and an open-ended question.
- The Preschool and Part C Surveys are virtually identical both consist of 14
 Likert items and an item about age when first referred. Preschool has two openended questions, and Part C has one.

• The Likert Scale is Strongly Disagree to Strongly Agree.

Additional Sample questions from School-Age Survey:

- I had the opportunity to provide input at my child's eligibility meeting for special education services.
- The team asked for and considered my input regarding my child's strengths and concerns.
- My child is receiving all of the services listed on the IEP.
- My child's IEP provides the direction and plan for helping him/her reach their long-term goals after he/she leaves public school.

Additional Sample questions from Preschool/Part C Surveys:


- ECSE/EI gives me useful information about who to contact when I have questions or concerns.
- ECSE/EI gives me information about my child's strengths, delays, or needs.
- ECSE/EI shares information with me about the progress my child has made on his/her IFSP.





Response Rates


OR Results Over Time: Response Rates








Oregon Parent Involvement Percent Over Time




Oregon Parent Involvement Percent Over Time




Oregon Ratings Over Time
