Please view the following survey request from the USDA for School Food Authorities.

The U.S. Department of Agriculture's Food and Nutrition Service (FNS) is conducting a web survey of all school food authorities (SFAs) that operate the Child Nutrition Programs and needs your input. The survey seeks to collect information on the continued challenges SFAs are facing due to ongoing food and labor supply chain disruptions, as well as the ways in which the transition to standard operations is impacting student participation in nutrition programs.

Your participation is vital to providing FNS with information they need to support school districts during this difficult time. Please take advantage of this opportunity to share your experiences from this school year and communicate the specific issues you are facing in your community directly to FNS.

### Announcing the 2022-2023 Oregon School Garden Survey!

Currently Oregon has 788 school gardens! That's over half the schools in Oregon.

We last did an extensive survey starting in 2017. We spent the past couple years getting feedback of what we are missing and adding or changing the questions we had. We are ready to send out the survey, and like everything else, we had to pause while COVID ran its course, as many gardens were inactive

We now have 44 questions; it should take 15-20 minutes to complete a survey for each garden. We ask that everyone should fill out a new survey for this, even if you have filed one out in the past. It's important to fill out the survey even if your garden is in hiatus or information while our evaluation team and Oregon Farm to School & School Garden Network continue to shape out future in school gardens

# Fresh Fruit and Vegetable Program (FFVP)

- Please continue to submit claims to FarmtoCNP@ode.oregon.gov according to the <u>SY 2021-2022 FFVP timeline</u>. September 2022 claims are due <u>Tuesday</u>, <u>November 29</u>, 2022.
- October begins FFVP SY 22-23. Claims beginning October 1, will be a
  part of this school year. We are still waiting on SY 22-23 funds from
  USDA and are unable to build subgrants in EGMS until funds are
  received, however, claims must still be submitted to
  farmtocnp@ode.oregon.gov by the monthly deadlines. Here are the
  SY 2022-2023 FFVP deadlines.
- The <u>mandatory annual FFVP training</u> is now available. This training will need to be completed before submitting your first claim for the 22-23 school year.

# Noncompetitive Reimbursement Grant

This progress report is mandatory and required of all sponsors that participate in the ODE Farm to CNP Reimbursement Grant. You will not be able to submit future reimbursement claims or receive additional funding until this report is submitted.

- The mandatory Training Webinar is now available on the

   view as your schedule allows. After viewing is complete, each grantee
   must fill out a <u>Reimbursement Grant Attestation Form</u>.
- Before Farm to CNP claims can be approved, returning sponsors must complete a <u>Final Report</u> from last biennium and new sponsors must complete a <u>Baseline Report</u>.

#### **Civil Rights and Complaints Process**

In accordance with Federal civil rights law and U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) civil rights regulations and policies, the USDA, its Agencies, offices, and employees, and institutions participating in or administering USDA programs are prohibited from discriminating based on race, color, national origin, sex, disability, age, or reprisal or retaliation for prior civil rights activity in any program or activity conducted or funded by USDA.
