USDA Farm to School Grant: Local Food for Schools (LFS)

The USDA has given our State just over \$2 million to administer a new Federal Farm to School reimbursement grant entitled USDA Local Food for Schools Cooperative Agreement Program, (or, the LFS Grant for short). This is in addition to our regular State-funded grant program that will be operated at the same time.

CNP Grant Updates

(Federal) USDA Farm to School Grant: Local Food For Schools (LFS) Grant

- Most Oregon School Districts participate in the State-funded Oregon Farm to School Grant for Reimbursement of Oregon Grown and Processed food. We anticipate that the State Grant just mentioned will continue to operate next biennium.
- However, we now have an additional Federal grant to administer. The USDA has given our State just over \$2 million to administer a new Federal Farm to School reimbursement grant entitled USDA Local Food for Schools Cooperative Agreement Program, (or, the LFS Grant for short). Again, this is in addition to our regular State-funded grant program that will be operated at the same time.
- The USDA has made these funds available to our state with the stipulation that we don't duplicate efforts already in place. Therefore, we will essentially make these funds available to Sponsors for specific items that aren't allowed in our regular State reimbursement grant.
- This grant is only available for NSLP sponsors. Eligible sponsors received an email with award allocation March 9, 2023.
- The mandatory training materials can be found on our website [here](#). This grant begins March 1, 2023 and close on August 31, 2024.



Fresh Fruit and Vegetable Program (FFVP)

- Please continue to submit claims to FarmtoCNP@ode.oregon.gov according to the [SY 2022-2023 FFVP timeline](#). January 2023 claims are due **Saturday, April 1, 2023**.
- Agreements and EGMS are currently on hold, but sponsors will be notified as soon as claims are ready to be entered. Claims must still be submitted to FarmtoCNP@ode.oregon.gov by the monthly deadlines. Here are the [SY 2022-2023 FFVP deadlines](#).
- The [mandatory annual FFVP training](#) is now available. This training will need to be completed before submitting your first claim for the 22-23 school year.

Noncompetitive Reimbursement Grant

- The Progress Reports for the non-competitive reimbursement grant are past due. You can link directly to the [progress report](#) or access it through the [Farm to CNP Reimbursement Grant web page](#). This progress report is mandatory and required of all sponsors that participate in the ODE Farm to CNP Reimbursement Grant. You will not be able to submit future reimbursement claims or receive additional funding until this report is submitted.
- The 2021-2023 claim form can be found on the [Farm to CNP Reimbursement Grant webpage](#). It is the first item under the "Resources for Claims" section.
- The mandatory Training Webinar is now available on the [Reimbursement Grant webpage](#). This is a recorded webinar. Please view as your schedule allows. After viewing is complete, each grantee must fill out a [Reimbursement Grant Attestation Form](#).
- Before Farm to CNP claims can be approved, returning sponsors must complete a [Final Report](#) from last biennium and new sponsors must complete a [Baseline Report](#).
