



Overview of the Latino/a/x and Indigenous Student Success Plan



Student Success Act

- Passed by the legislature in 2019 (House Bill 3427)
- \$2 billion investment in Oregon's schools per biennium (when fully implemented)
- Funding divided:
 - 20% Early Learning Account
 - 50% Student Investment Account
 - 30% Statewide Educational Initiatives Account*
- Funding comes from the new Corporate Activity Tax (CAT)
- Equity a priority across the SSA



- Implement a statewide education plan for Latino/a/x & Indigenous students.
- Form an advisory group to advise the department regarding:
 - Development and implementation of the plan;
 - Eligibility criteria, applicant selection processes and expectations for recipients of grant awards; and
 - Adoption of rules by the State Board of Education for the implementation of the plan.



- The plan must address:
 - The disparities experienced by Latino/a/x students in every indicator of academic success;
 - The historical practices leading to disproportionate outcomes for Latino/a/x students; and
 - The educational needs of Latino/a/x students from early childhood through post-secondary education as determined by examining culturally appropriate best practices in this state and across the nation.



- Address the disproportionate rate of disciplinary incidents involving plan students compared to all students in the education system;
- Increase parental engagement in the education of plan students;
- Increase the engagement of plan students in educational activities before and after regular school hours;
- Increase early childhood education and kindergarten readiness for plan students;




- Improve literacy and numeracy levels among plan students between kindergarten and grade three;
- Support plan student transitions to middle school and through the middle school and high school grades to maintain and improve academic performance;
- Support culturally responsive pedagogy and practices from early childhood through post-secondary education;
- Support the development of culturally responsive curricula from early childhood through post-secondary education;



- Increase attendance of plan students in community colleges and professional certification programs; and
- Increase attendance of plan students in four-year post-secondary institutions of education.
