

Oregon's Health Care Workforce Supply

Based on data collected during 2016 and 2017

This report provides a snapshot of the state's health care workforce supply using data collected by the Oregon Health Authority in collaboration with 17 health professional licensing boards.

As Oregon's population increases and the number of Oregonians with health insurance grows, it is important to understand the health care workforce to make sure the supply of providers is able to meet the increasing demand. Since 2010, Oregon's population has increased by 7.9 percent. Simultaneously, Oregon's insurance coverage rate has increased from 85% in 2011 to nearly 94% today (2017 Oregon Health Insurance Survey, Oregon Health Authority). This increase

in covered individuals may stress the capacity of health care providers to deliver health services.

Determining the supply of health care workers involves more than simply adding up the number of people working in health care in Oregon. Other factors such as the ratio of providers to the population served and the future plans of providers to expand or reduce their practice must be taken into account. health care training programs, future migration of health care workers to Oregon from other states, and the types of insurance accepted by providers are also important factors, but are outside the scope of this report.

Number of health care professionals

Table 1a shows trends over time in the number of health care professionals who are licensed to work in Oregon. Since reporting began in 2009, the number of providers licensed in Oregon has increased for all of the profiled health professions except certified nursing assistants. During the 2015 Oregon Legislative session, SB 230 added ten additional health licensing boards to the Health Care Workforce Reporting Program. Data collection for these boards began in in 2016. Table 1b shows the number of health care professionals licensed by boards that began data reporting since 2016. Trend data from these boards will be available in future reports.

Not all licensees who hold a license in Oregon are actively working in the health care field in Oregon. Further, not all active licensees complete the workforce survey (e.g. new licensees). Thus, the estimate of the number of licensees practicing in Oregon is derived from the percent of survey respondents that are actively practicing in the state as shown in Table 2.

This estimate provides a more accurate picture of the supply of health care workers in Oregon. For example, pharmacists holding an Oregon license are less likely to work in the state than most other licensed professionals, as seen by a relatively small active practice rate (52.7%).

FTE and Population-to-provider ratio

Because not all providers work full time and many spend at least some time outside of direct patient care (e.g. teaching and administration), it may be more helpful to look at the number of provider FTEs in the state and the number of health care provider direct care FTEs. **Total estimated FTE and estimated direct patient care FTE are shown in Table 3.**

Health care workforce supply can also be measured by the population-to-provider ratio: it provides insight into the number of individuals each health care provider might serve. It is calculated by dividing the number of people living in an area by the number of health care provider FTEs actively practicing in the same area. A lower population-toprovider ratio suggests more access to care for individuals living in a certain region. A higher ratio suggests less access.

Table 3 also shows the statewide population-toprovider ratio, based on the number of estimated direct patient care FTEs. At present, population-to-provider ratios vary by profession from 176 people per registered nurse to 110,224 people per clinical nurse specialist. To put these ratios into context, one must consider the demand for services provided by the health care worker and the amount of time a provider may spend with a patient. For example, dental hygienists, providing preventive care to a wide range of the population, generally have a smaller population-toprovider ratio than podiatrists, who provide specialized care to a small segment of the population. As such, the appropriate ratio to meet the demand at the state level may differ between occupations. (See Appendix A for county level estimates of provider counts, patient care FTE, and population-to-provider ratios.)

Future practice plans

Within each profession and in the aggregate, the health care workforce is always changing. Professionals may move out of state, change the number of hours they work, or retire; each of these affects the overall supply of health care workers.

The majority (76.6%) of providers actively practicing in Oregon plan no changes to their practice, 4.6 percent intend to leave the workforce, and 5.3 percent intend to reduce their practice hours in the next two years (Figure 1). The primary reason for leaving the workforce differs by occupation (Figure 2). Some are more likely to retire (e.g. clinical nurse specialists), while others are much more likely to report plans to leave the occupation and move to another field (e.g. certi-

fied pharmacy technicians). New licensees and increased practice hours for other licensees may make up for these decreases to the workforce. In the next two years, 6.5 percent of the workforce plans to increase their practice hours.
