

Estimated direct patient care FTE by county






Number of years licensed in Oregon§



How LRCPs spend their time


On average, LRCPs spend **77.1%** of their time in **direct patient care**.




Practice plans in the next two years



Practice settings and specialties




Polysomnographic technologists (LPSGT)
