Overview: Oregon's 1115 Waiver HRSN Benefit

- Oregon's most recent 1115 Waiver was approved for October 2022 –
 September 2027.
- The waiver allows the state to use federal Medicaid funds for Health-Related Social Needs (HRSN) benefits for populations who are in "transition".

HRSN services include:









Housing Nutrition Climate Outreach & Supports Supports Engagement

Member eligibility:

To qualify for a HRSN service, an individual must:

- Meet the eligibility for one or more of the covered populations
- Meet clinical and social risk criteria for service to be medically necessary

Why align components of the SDOH metric & 1115 Waiver HRSN benefit?

- Reduce over-screening
- Improve overall care coordination
- Build efficient partnerships
- Optimize resource allocation
- Enhance data collection, sharing, and analysis

Hypothetical Case Study: Emily



- Aging out of foster care system
- No known relatives
- Completed high school and aspires to go to college
- Housing and food insecure
- Family history of diabetes with clinical risk factors, history of depression due to trauma

Proper training on screening and referral practices benefits all members

Screening Practices

Understanding which tools are being used including when and where, working towards better alignment



Community Investments

Leverage CCBF (Waiver), SHARE and HRS CBI Funding to build capacity and access to SDOH resources with an equity lens

Community Partner Engagement

Developing an agreed upon framework and establishing partner agreements

Data, Eligibility & Referral

Establish clear protocols for data exchange and making referrals based on the results of the screening and eligibility process.
