# Frequently Used Language

- HTO – Healthier Together Oregon
- SHIP – State Health Improvement Plan
- CHIP – Community Health Improvement Plan
- CHA – Community Health Assessment

# What is the funding?

Our goal: Form and strengthen partnerships among organizations that are working towards health equity through their CHIPs and CHAs

- Organizations can apply for \$25,000
- 5 organizations will be awarded
- Funds must be spent by **September 30, 2024**

# How can the funds be used?

1

Projects that support strategies and priorities outlined in local CHIPs

2

Projects that form and strengthen partnerships among local organizations to implement CHIP

3

Projects that collect data and community-specific information to develop a CHA

# Allowable Activities - Examples

*Ex: One of your CHIP's priorities is food security and access*

- Purchase supplies for an emergency food location
- Purchase supplies for a community garden

*Examples for forming partnerships to implement CHIP*

- Hire a facilitator to convene partners for planning
- Pay for staff time to develop shared agreements among participating organizations

# Not Allowable Activities

- Direct medical or behavioral health services
  - Medical equipment and supplies,
  - Vaccines and medications,
  - Naloxone and syringes,
  - drug disposal programs, or
  - clinical education
- Motor vehicles
  - e.g., Mobile Health Clinics
- Politics, advocacy and research



# Who is eligible?

- Groups of two or more partners who are working on, or want to work on, a CHIP project
  - **At least one of the following:** local public health authorities, coordinated care organizations, nonprofit hospitals, or Tribal Health Departments, and
  - **At least one** community-based organization, regional health equity coalition or other **community partner**
