PROCLAMATION
OFFICE OF THE GOVERNOR

- WHEREAS:** A commitment to supporting maternal and child health creates a better Oregon; and
- WHEREAS:** Steps can be taken to help ensure a healthy pregnancy, such as having access to affordable and culturally responsive health care, taking a daily vitamin with folic acid before and during pregnancy, and stopping alcohol or drug use during pregnancy; and
- WHEREAS:** Even when steps are taken to support a healthy pregnancy, birth anomalies still occur among families of every race, ethnicity, health history, and economic status, including an estimated 2,000 infants in Oregon each year; and
- WHEREAS:** The Centers for Disease Control observes National Birth Defects Awareness Month each January, and although birth anomalies are sometimes referred to as birth “defects,” persons affected are not “defective”; and
- WHEREAS:** Early identification and intervention services, family peer support, and community connections improve the lives of children and families and enrich our communities; and
- WHEREAS:** We can all create environments in which children with birth anomalies can meet their full potential and lead important roles in our communities without limits.

THEREFORE:** I, Kate Brown, Governor of the State of Oregon, hereby proclaim **January 2022** to be

OREGON BIRTH ANOMALIES AWARENESS MONTH

in Oregon and encourage all Oregonians to join in this observance.
